A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke (Lk 6:27-38)

Be mercíful as your Father is mercíful.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'I say this to you who are listening: Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who treat you badly. To the man who slaps you on one cheek, present the other cheek too; to the man who takes your cloak from you, do not refuse your tunic. ASSESSMENT PORTFOLIOS

All students at Holy Eucharist School have an Assessment Portfolio. This portfolio enables teachers to have a consistent approach throughout the school in collecting data and evidence of your child's work.

This Assessment Portfolio will be sent home at the beginning and at the end of each term.

At the beginning of each term the folder will contain a Term Outline.

Term Outline

- The Term Outline has a summary of what is going to be covered in your child's year level, across all curriculum areas for that term.
- The Term Outline will go home at the **beginning** of each term inside the Assessment Portfolio and **parents will be required to read and sign the sheet. The Term Outline** needs to be **returned** to school **inside** the Assessment Portfolio.



At the end of each term the folder will contain Work Samples (evidence).

Work Samples

- Throughout the term, teachers will collect samples of your child's work. These samples are collected as evidence of your child's achievements and as an indication of what has been taught.
- The samples collected should also correlate with what has been documented on the Term Outline sheet.
- The work samples are corrected by the teacher and should have relevant comments to support what the student has achieved.

Parents are invited to <u>look through the Assessment Portfolio with their child.</u> Parents are requested to <u>write positive comments</u> in the space provided (on the yellow cover sheet) and to sign it.

Term outlines/Assessment Portfolios will go home on Friday 22nd February and need to be returned by Wednesday 27th February.

COMMITMENT TO CHILD SAFETY

All Assessment Portfolios will contain a copy of Holy Eucharist School's Commitment to Child Safety in English and in Vietnamese. The purpose of Holy Eucharist School's Commitment Statement is to demonstrate our strong commitment to the care, safety and wellbeing of all students at our school. It provides an outline of the policies, procedures and strategies developed to keep students safe from harm, including all forms of abuse in our school environment, online and in other locations provided by the school.

This commitment takes into account relevant legislative requirements within the state of Victoria, including the specific requirements of the Victorian Child Safe Standards as set out in Ministerial Order No. 870. This Commitment Statement applies to school staff, clergy, school employees, including volunteers, and contractors.

All present and future staff at Holy Eucharist School will be required to read and sign a copy of the School's Commitment to Child Safety as well as the School's Code of Conduct. We also urge all

SCHOOL PHOTOS

School Photos will be taken on Monday 4th March 2019. All students need to wear their full Summer Uniform and black school shoes (Please see School Uniform below). Each child has been given individual order forms. If you would like to order photos you will need to fill in the order form, pay the correct amount and return it to your class teacher on photograph day. Alternatively, you can order photos online and they will be accepted up to 2 days after photo day (without incurring the late fee). <u>Please note:</u> If students are <u>not wearing the correct school uniform, a note will be sent home</u> informing the parent/guardian. This note will need to be signed by the parent/guardian and the <u>name of the student will be recorded at the school office</u>. *NB: Hats are compulsory for all children and staff during Term 1 and Term 4.*

PARENT/TEACHER CHATS

To help us better engage your child in learning and to develop your child holistically, we need to involve you as our key partners in education. To do that, we will be having Parent - Teacher Chats on Wednesday 13th March 2019 from 12:10pm until 6:00pm. Students will be finishing school at 12pm on this day.

During this meeting your child's teacher will be asking questions which will provide the teacher with information to help your child. eg: your child's birthplace, date of arrival in Australia, first language/s spoken, etc. The Parent – Teacher Chats will be approximately 10 minutes in length - just enough time for you and your child's teacher to meet and communicate. Next week you will be asked to choose your preferred time and to return it to your child's teacher.

Parent-Teacher Chats are a great opportunity to communicate with your child's teacher and to hear about how your child has settled into their new class. However, they are also a great way to discuss any concerns or questions you may have regarding your child. It is important that you take the time to think about the things you would like to discuss with your child's teacher, to ensure you make the most of your allocated time.

MEDICAL SURVEY

Over a week ago, the students were given a Medical Survey. Parents were asked to complete this survey to enable us to provide you with relevant medical forms for your child (if applicable). Please note that medication can only be administered by office staff once the appropriate forms have been completed by a medical practitioner and are returned to school. Medical surveys need to be returned without further delay.

NAPLAN 2019

The students in Years 3 and 5 will be taking part in the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) on 14th, 15th and 16th May 2019.

NAPLAN is an annual assessment for students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. NAPLAN tests the sorts of skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life, such as reading, writing, spelling and numeracy. The assessments are undertaken nationwide, every year, in the second full week in May.



NAPLAN is made up of tests in the four areas (or 'domains') of:

- Reading
- Writing
- Language Conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation)

NAPLAN tests skills in Literacy and Numeracy that are developed over time through the school curriculum.

LANGUAGE OTHER THAN ENGLISH (LOTE) - MANDARIN

Learning another language in addition to English extends student's literacy repertoires and their capacity to communicate. It also builds on their understanding of the nature of language, culture, and the processes of communication.

This year at Holy Eucharist School, Chinese (Mandarin) will be taught from Grade Prep to Grade 6. Mandarin is also taught at neighbouring secondary schools where students can continue learning about the language and culture.

Learning an additional language at school "broadens students' horizons about the personal, social, cultural and employment opportunities that are available in an increasingly interconnected and interdependent world" (Victorian Curriculum, 2019).

The purpose of having an additional language at school is to enable students to:

- communicate in the language they are learning
- understand the relationship between language, culture and learning
- develop intercultural capabilities
- understand themselves as communicators.

Please note that Vietnamese is taught at the school on weekends. This program aims to assist students in maintaining their first language. However, having an additional language such as Mandarin, enables students to develop their "intercultural capability, including understanding of and respect for diversity and difference, and an openness to different experiences and perspectives" (Victorian Curriculum, 2019).

SECOND HAND UNIFORM STALL

We are in the process of trying to organise a Second Hand Uniform Stall at the school. This is a great way for our school community to support each other by providing unwanted school uniforms which are in good useable condition.

We will gladly accept donations of second hand uniforms (including school shoes), which can be worn by our students.

Uniform items can be left at the school office. Once we have a sufficient supply of uniforms, we will then be able to organise a stall. If you would like to assist in anyway by donating, washing and sorting of clothes, please contact Michael Bonnici at the school office.
