Fifth Sunday of Lent - Year C



A reading from the holy Gospel according to John (Jn 8:1-11)

Let the person without sin be the first to throw a stone.

Jesus went to the Mount of Olives. At daybreak he appeared in the Temple again; and as all the people came to him, he sat down and began to teach them.

The scribes and **Pharisees** brought a woman along who had been caught committing adultery; and making her stand there in full view of everybody, they said to Jesus, 'Master, this woman was caught in the very act of committing adultery, and Moses has ordered us in the Law to condemn women like this to death by stoning. What have you to say?' They asked him this as a test, looking for something to use against him. But Jesus bent down and started writing on the ground with his finger. As they persisted with their question, he looked up and said, 'If there is one of you who has not sinned, let him be the first to throw a stone at her.' Then he bent down and wrote on the ground again. When they heard this they went away one by one, beginning with the eldest, until Jesus

was left alone with the woman, who

remained standing there. He looked up

and said, 'Woman, where are they? Has

no one condemned you?' 'No one, sír,'

she replied. 'Neither do I condemn you,'

said Jesus 'go away, and don't sin any

more.'

LITERACY AND NUMERACY TESTING

The teachers at Holy Eucharist School will be conducting Literacy and Numeracy assessments on your child. We have set aside two days for testing and have provided you with a date and a time. Your child will need to be at school on:

Thursday 4th April (tomorrow) <u>OR</u> Friday 5th April.

Your child is only required to be at school during their allocated time. They will be completing a series of tests with their class teacher and will go for no longer than 45 minutes.

The information obtained from these assessments will be used to help your child's learning throughout the year. Testing is compulsory for all students at the beginning and end of each year and the results are submitted to Catholic Education Melbourne. Therefore, attendance is essential. Students are only required to be at school for 45 minutes to complete their testing. When the testing is completed, students must return home. Please ensure children are not left unsupervised at school.

NAPLAN 2019

The students in Years 3 and 5 will be taking part in the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) on 14th, 15th and 16th May 2019.



NAPLAN is an annual assessment for students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. NAPLAN tests the sorts of skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life, such as reading, writing, spelling and numeracy. The assessments are undertaken nationwide, every year, in the second full week in May.

NAPLAN is made up of tests in the four areas (or 'domains') of:

- Reading
- Writing
- Language Conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation)

NAPLAN tests skills in Literacy and Numeracy that are developed over time through the school curriculum.

SECOND HAND UNIFORM STALL

We are in the process of trying to organise a Second Hand Uniform Stall at the school. This is a great way for our school community to support each other by providing unwanted school uniforms which are in good useable condition.

We will gladly accept donations of second hand uniforms (including school shoes), which can be worn by our students. Uniform items can be left at the school office.
