Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time – Year C



A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke (Lk 11:1-13)

Ask, and it will be given to you.

Once Jesus was in a certain place praying, and when he had finished, one of his disciples said, 'Lord, teach us to pray, just as John taught his disciples.' He said to them, 'Say this when you pray:

"Father, may your name be held holy,
your kingdom come;
give us each day our daily bread,
and forgive us our sins,
for we ourselves forgive each one who is in debt to us.
And do not put us to the test."

He also said to them, 'Suppose one of you has a friend and goes to him in the middle of the night to say, "My friend, lend me three loaves, because a friend of mine on his travels has just arrived at my house and I have nothing to offer him"; and the man answers from inside the house, "Do not bother me. The door is bolted now, and my children and I are in bed; I cannot get up to give it to you." I tell you, if the man does not get up and give it him for friendship's sake, persistence will be enough to make him get up and give his friend all he wants.

'So I say to you: Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened to you. For the one who asks always receives; the one who searches always finds; the one who knocks will always have the door opened to him. What father among you would hand his son a stone when he asked for bread? Or hand him a snake instead of a fish? Or hand him a scorpion if he asked for an egg? If you then, who are evil, know how to give your children what is good, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!

Every year for over seven decades the Children's Book Council of Australia (CBCA) has united children and literature through Children's Book Week. Officially Book Week is held in August during the week following the announcement of the Book of the Year Awards. During Book Week, libraries, schools, children, authors and illustrators celebrate Australian children's books and the joy of reading. A slogan and theme have accompanied CBCA Children's Book Week since 1945. This year's slogan is 'Reading is My Secret Power'. What is the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data (NCCD)?

Schools must now complete the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD) every year. It counts the number of students who receive **additional adjustments or 'help'** at school because of a disability. The NCCD helps governments plan for the needs of students with disability.

In the NCCD the word 'disability' comes from the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 (DDA). There are four types of disability that the school can choose from: sensory, cognitive, social-emotional and physical. All schools have been counting students in the NCCD since 2015. The government will use the NCCD data as part of the funding to schools.

Catholic education in the Archdiocese of Melbourne (CEM) will also now use NCCD data to support and provide additional funding to students at Holy Eucharist, who require additional support and adjustments in their learning, to help them access the Victorian Curriculum.

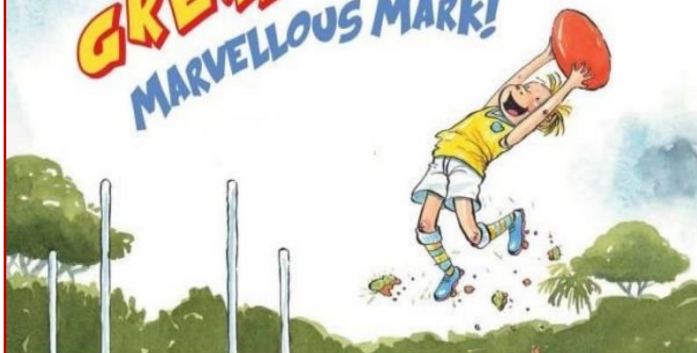


Holy Eucharist Primary School would like to say a BIG thank you to Bunnings Watergardens
