
SCHOOL HATS IN TERM 4

DAY FOR DANIEL - 25th OCTOBER 2019

National Day for Daniel is Australia's largest child safety awareness and education day. Its goal is to make Australia a safe place for all children. The Daniel Morcombe Foundation Inc. was established by parents Bruce and Denise Morcombe in 2005 after their son Daniel was abducted and murdered in December 2003 while waiting to catch a bus on the Sunshine Coast. The Foundation was established as a lasting legacy to Daniel and now has two main aims; to educate children on how to stay safe in a physical and online environment and to support young victims of crime.

On Friday 25th October (Mission Market Day), children at Holy Eucharist School and schools around Australia have been encouraged to Wear Red, Educate and Donate. Holy Eucharist will be donating part of the proceeds from the Mission Market to this worthy cause.

THE 2020 SCHOOL YEAR - LITERACY AND NUMERACY TESTING

Literacy and Numeracy testing provides teachers with important data to inform teaching and to enable teachers to target specific student needs. Over the past few years, Literacy and Numeracy testing took place at the beginning of Term 1 prior to the students commencing school. Last year we had moved the Literacy and Numeracy Testing to the end of Term 1, due to the large number of students who travel overseas with their families to celebrate the Lunar New Year.

As Term 1 in 2020 is only 8.5 weeks, we have decided as a staff to move the Literacy and Numeracy Testing to March, just before the Labour Day weekend. This will enable the teachers to have their data earlier and will allow them with sufficient time to submit it to Catholic Education Melbourne (CEM).

The changes for 2020 are as follows:

- Students in Grade 1 to Grade 6 will commence school on Wednesday 29th January 2019 at 8:55am 3:15pm.
- Students in Grade Prep commence school on Thursday 30th January 2020 at 8:55am 12:15pm.
- Grade Prep students will finish at 12:15pm until Friday 7th February 2020. (Preps have no school on Wednesdays in February)
- Grade Prep students are at school from 8:55am to 3:15pm from Monday 10th February 2020.
- Literacy and Numeracy Testing will be held on Thursday 5th and Friday 6th March 2020 (Students will be given an appointment time School Closure Days).
- Parent/Teacher Chats will be held on Wednesday 18th March 2019. (All students finish at 12pm)

Testing in the middle of Term 1 will mean that:

- Students and their families will have arrived back from their overseas holiday.
- Students will have had the opportunity to settle into their new grades and will have met their teacher.
- Class teachers will have had the opportunity to meet parents in order to assist students in their class.
- Teachers have sufficient time to submit Literacy and Numeracy testing to CEM.
