NAPLAN 2020

The students in Years 3 and 5 will be taking part in the National Assessment Program - Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) on 12th, 13th and 14th May 2020. NAPLAN is an annual assessment for students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. NAPLAN tests the sorts of skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life, such as reading, writing, spelling and numeracy. The assessments are undertaken nationwide, every year, in the second full week in May.

NAPLAN is made up of tests in the four areas (or 'domains') of:

- Reading
- Writing
- Language Conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation)
- Numeracy

NAPLAN tests skills in Literacy and Numeracy that are developed over time through the school curriculum.
