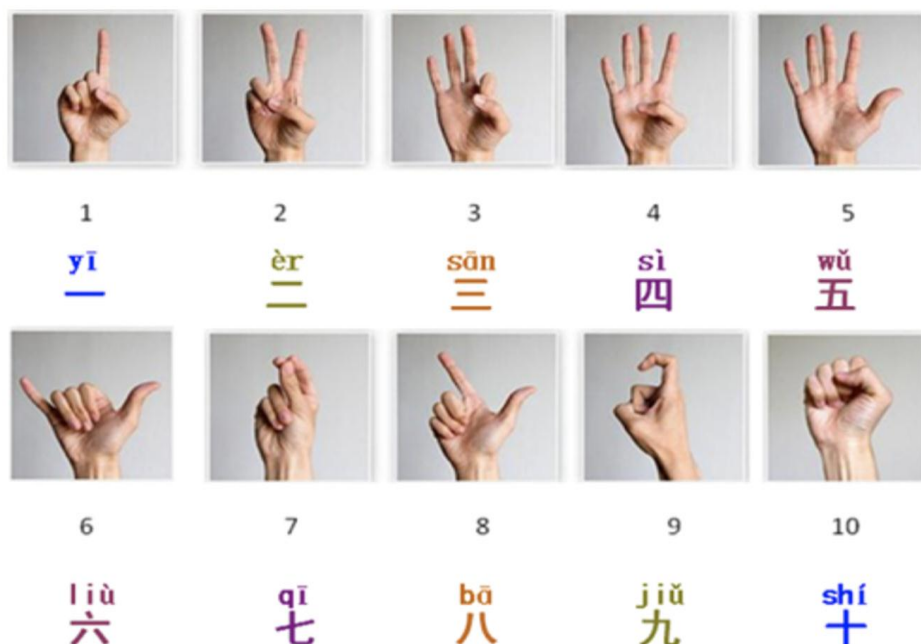

1. 爷 爷	yé ye	Grandpa (dad 's father)
2. 奶 奶	nǎi nai	Grandma (dad's mother)
3. 外 公	wài gong	Grandpa (mum's father)
4. 外 婆	wài pó	Grandma (mum's mother)
5. 爸 爸	bà ba	Dad
6. 妈 妈	Ma ma	Mum
7. 哥 哥	Ge ge	Older brother
8. 弟 弟	dì di	Younger brother
9. 姐 姐	jǐe jie	Older sister
10. 妹 妹	mèi mei	Younger sister

Activity 5 — Trace the the Chinese characters: (1. 爷 爷, 2. 奶 奶) by following the stroke order.
