# FEAST OF ST MARY OF THE CROSS MACKILLOP (8th August)

Mary MacKillop was born in Melbourne on 15<sup>th</sup> January 1842 in Melbourne and died in Sydney on 8<sup>th</sup> August 1909. She took the religious name Mary of the Cross. Responding to the isolation of colonial families she pioneered a new form of religious life to provide education for their children. She and her sisters shared the life of the poor and the homeless, offering special care to destitute women and children. Mary is remembered for her eagerness to discover God's will in all things, for her charity in the face of calumny and for her abiding trust in God's providence.

Thank you to all our mums, dads and carers for meeting the challenge of becoming teachers at home; you have done an amazing job and your children have seen you as the educators you are in their lives.

We will continue to offer limited on-site learning for those students who need to access this, including for students on days when they are not able to be supervised at home and no other arrangements can be made.

### **ONLINE LEARNING - ATTENDANCE**

Just a reminder that it is a legal requirement in for students in Melbourne to complete the set tasks outlined in the Remote Learning packs. Remote Learning is just like a "normal" school day and attendance is compulsory. All students are to complete set tasks during school hours.

Students in Grades 3 to Grade 6 are asked to login each day at 9am on Google Classroom and will need to complete the attendance log. Students in the Grades Prep to Grade 2 are required to login on Class Dojo and to complete their attendance. <u>If a student does not login they will be marked absent for the day.</u>

If a student is unable to take part in remote learning for any particular reason, the parent/carer is required to notify the teacher via email or can telephone the school office, explaining the reason for their child's absence. Please note that all absences will be recorded in the Semester 2 report.

Please remember, if your child is attending school during remote learning, it is vital that they do not come to school if they have any symptoms like sore throat, temperature, tiredness, loss of taste or smell, tummy pains or shortness of breath. They will be sent home if they show any of these symptoms. All children attending school will have their temperature taken on arrival. Any child who registers a temperature of 37.5 or more, will be sent home. It is important that your emergency contact is available if, for any reason you are unable to pick up your child if we ring you. The constant message is for all of us to be responsible in the actions we take. By keeping yourself safe, you are keeping your families, your colleagues and your friends safe.

### REMOTE LEARNING PACKS

All students in Grades Prep to Grade 6 are required to complete the assigned tasks allocated by the classroom teachers. Please note that all completed work must be returned/submitted every Friday, as these samples will be used for assessment and reporting purposes.

Many parents/carers have requested for Take Home Packs to be made available for collection each week. We have made these available for our families and have accommodated for students who do not have access to digital technology. However, each week there are a number of take home packs left in the hall, which highlights the fact that many of our students are not doing their work.

As of next week, all students in Grades Prep to Grade 6 will be commencing their third week of remote learning. All students are required to complete the assigned tasks allocated by the classroom teacher(s). Please note that all completed work must be returned/submitted every Friday, as these samples will be used for assessment and reporting purposes.

Take Home packs are available from the school hall every Friday from 8:45 until 3:00pm. Alternatively, you may wish to download the packs from our school website. If you are downloading these, can you please notify the classroom teacher via Class Dojo.

### PARENT/TEACHER INTERVIEWS

Parent/Teacher interviews commenced this week. Thank you to all the parents/carers who made themselves available to be contacted over the phone or via Zoom. We still have Grade Prep, 1 and 2 to take part in the Parent/Teacher Interviews. Interview times for these grades are inside the student's Assessment Portfolio and will be held on the following days:

- Grade 2 Friday 31<sup>st</sup> July.
- Grade 1 Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> August.
- Grade Prep Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> August.

### **VISITOR ACCESS**

Parents/carers/visitors are <u>not to enter the school grounds</u>. The school office will be closed and will only be accessible by appointment only. The School Office will only allow 2 parents at any given time to enter. An admin officer will be at the door to provide hand sanitiser to these parents. If parents are required to be onsite, they must wear mask, minimise their time and practise physical distancing.

### COMMUNICATION

Please note, that our Teaching Staff may not be able to respond to emails or telephone calls immediately. The school accepts that a response within 2 working days is acceptable. Our Parent Code of Conduct Policy stipulates that responses will not be made outside of working hours or during school holidays, with the exception of an emergency.

### **FACE COVERINGS/MASKS**

Face coverings are mandatory for people aged 12 and over. These measures will slow the spread of coronavirus (COVID-19) and help protect our school community. Students who attend primary school for onsite supervision will not be required to wear a face covering. Students who are aged 12 by Year 6 will not be required to wear face coverings. The Victorian Chief Health Officer has advised that it is not practical to require some primary school students to wear face coverings while others are not required to.

Parents, guardians and carers will be required to wear face coverings whenever they leave the house, including for school dropoff and pick-up. Students or staff who have a medical condition – including problems with their breathing, a serious skin condition on the face, a disability or a mental health condition – are not required to wear a face covering.

### **SCHOOL LITURGY ONLINE**

We will be having an online whole school Liturgy of the Word to celebrate the feast of our Australian saint, Saint Mary MacKillop (St Mary of the Cross). All students and their families are invited to attend this celebration led by Fr Vincent next Thursday 6th August at 9:30am. The celebration on Zoom will held before remote learning and will go for approximately 15 minutes. The link to the celebration will be posted on Class Dojo.

### **SUNDAY MASSES**

St Patrick's Cathedral will continue to broadcast Sunday Mass (live) via online streaming and also on C31 (digital channel 44). Broadcasting Sunday Mass on television and online continues to enable the faith community to gather and pray remotely, during the COVID-19 lockdown. In particular, the television service is essential, especially for those in our community with limited internet access.
