- 1. First, choose a topic and come up with the first line of your poem.
- 2. Next, list some words that rhyme with the last word.



# Reading: Poetry

Today we revisit *acrostic poems*. These are **poems** where certain letters in each line spell out a word or phrase. *Acrostic poems* don't have to rhyme.

The purpose of an acrostic poem is to describe a particular topic.



The best way to create an acrostic poem is to think of the topic and then brainstorm as many words to describe it. You can then use these words to create an *acrostic poem*.
