#### **Acting Principal's Message**

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

It has been so wonderful to see the students at the gate and to welcome them back to school. Over the past few days I have had the opportunity to observe our students onsite, and it has been great to see the progress that so many of them have made whilst learning at home. It was also pleasing to see that the children have settled back to school really well.

Since we have retuned to onsite learning our students and teachers have spent time reconnecting with each other. Teachers in Grades Prep to Grade 6 have also dedicated lots of time to focus on student wellbeing. We need to remember that our students can only do their best learning when they feel happy, safe, connected and optimistic.

Our next priority will be learning and teaching. During remote and flexible learning some students continued to make progress in their learning whilst others have maintained their rate of progress. However, some, despite their best efforts and the efforts of their families and teachers, have found remote and flexible learning difficult. In the coming weeks we will continue supporting those who have fallen behind, whilst those who have made significant progress, will be further extended in their learning.

Please remember that all students should be back at school and that the only reason for your child to be absent from school is if they have a severe medical condition or if they present with COVID symptoms. If your child does have a severe medical condition and the doctor has given consent for them to stay at home, then you will need to let us know.

As mentioned previously, October is known as the month of the Rosary. Praying the rosary is a beautiful Catholic devotion. As a school community we have been praying a decade of the Rosary every Thursday, during the month of October. During each week we have meditating on the Glorious Mysteries. The five meditations in the Glorious Mysteries help us to remember the wonderful triumphs in Jesus' life that he shared through Mary. We hope that you will continue joining us each Thursday morning at 9:20am via Zoom. (The link is posted each week on Class Dojo).



#### SCHOOL ENTRANCE AND PICK UP ZONE:

Each grade level will have a designated gate to enter/leave the school. These are as follows:

- Gate 1 (Next to the hall) Grade Prep and Grade 3
- Gate 2 (Next to the church) Grade 1 and Grade 4
- Gate 3 (Admin gate) Grades 6
- Gate 4 (O'Brien Drive) Grade 2 and Grade 5

Please also remember the 1.5 metre distance rule when lining up at the gates during drop off and pick up times. In the morning, the prep teachers will collect their student from the gate. However, all other classroom teachers will be in their rooms to let the students in. All classroom teachers will take the students to the gate at home time and will wait for students to be picked up. If you have more than one child at school, you can drop off and pick up your children from a preferred gate, so long as you have one child who belongs to the year level specified at the gate.

#### **TEMPERATURE MONITORING**

All children attending school will have their temperature taken upon arrival. Any child who registers a temperature of 37.5 or more, will be sent home with the parent/guardian. **Also**, students will be sent home if they present with symptoms such as a sore throat, temperature, tiredness, loss of taste or smell, tummy pains or shortness of breath. It is important that your emergency contact is available, particularly, if you are unable to pick up your child when we ring you. **The constant message is for all of us to be responsible in the actions we take.** By keeping yourself safe, you are keeping your families, your colleagues and your friends safe.

#### **CAMP AUSTRALIA**

Camp Australia have new operating hours in order to accommodate our staggered starts and finishing times. Camp Australia will be operating Before School Care each morning until 8:40am and After School Care from 3pm after school.

#### **SCHOOL HATS**

School hats are compulsory at Holy Eucharist School during Term 1 and Term 4. Hats need to be worn during recess, lunch and during Physical Education (PE). Our School Policy stipulates... No hat... no play...

#### **ASSESSMENT AND REPORTING - SEMESTER 2**

As was the case in Semester 1, 2020, student reporting in Semester 2, 2020 will look a little different to previous years. Reports will reflect adjustments that schools have made to their local curriculum programs in response to the needs and aspirations of their school communities, and the disruption caused by COVID-19. In many cases, this will mean that less curriculum content was covered than was planned. Student reporting in Semester 2, 2020 should focus on what progress has been made and what has been achieved by each child. Schools are encouraged to keep reports simple but make them meaningful.

Schools must provide

- •A written report in an accessible form and easy for parents/carers to understand for Semester 2, 2020;
- •The opportunity for parents/carers and students to discuss the school report with teachers, consistent with each school's usual end of year approach but subject to any relevant health advice

For English and Mathematics, schools must:

- Provide a short description of what was taught; and
- Report achievement by making a teacher judgement against the Victorian Curriculum F-10 achievement standards; and
- Report progress from the last time that curriculum area was reported on; and
- Include an age-related five-point scale.

For all other curriculum areas delivered, including Religious Education, schools must provide a short description of what was taught.

- •In addition, schools must provide a teacher judgement against the Victorian Curriculum F-10 achievement standards.
- •Schools must also provide a comment on student participation and engagement in the learning program offered in Semester 2 2020, with reference to the Personal and Social Capability in the curriculum.

#### SCHOOL PHOTOS

School photos this year have been postponed a number of times due to the COVID-19. Hopefully our school photos will be taken on <u>Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> November 2020</u>. All students need to wear their full Summer Uniform and black school shoes.



SchoolPix want all students to have the opportunity to have a 2020 school photo taken. They have made a decision not to offer a traditional group photo for the remainder of the year. Instead they will take a portrait photo of each student and then create a "composite" group for each class using the portrait images. This will enable everyone to adhere to social distancing rules.

#### **BRIMBANK CITY COUNCIL - SCHOOL CROSSING**

Brimbank City Council have implemented a few changes to the way the School Crossing Supervisors work during Covid-19. Keeping safe during this time is paramount for everyone in our community. Social distancing must be followed by those in the workforce as well as those who are moving around the community.

The following is a list of changes being implemented by Brimbank City Council:

- . Compulsory wearing of masks WHISTLES WILL NOT BE USED
- · Hand signals and voice commands will be used to instruct pedestrians in place of the whistle
- To maintain social distancing, all supervisors will stand on the opposite side of the crossing to where pedestrians approach
- · Morning shift: School Side location
- · Afternoon shift: Opposite side to school

#### VICTORIA POLICE - SAFE PRACTICES AT SCHOOL DROP OFF AND PICK UP

Senior Constable Cassie Norman from the Proactive Policing Unit, has advised schools in the area that there are many parents and carers who are taking serious risks and driving in an unacceptable manner, putting themselves and others in danger.

Already this week they have seen numerous near misses involving primary aged children nearly being struck by vehicles as well as a number of collisions. It is imperative that children are dropped off and collected from school in a safe and legal manner.

Some of the things that the police are seeing are things including; dropping off and picking up children whilst stationary at a school crossing, parking illegally, performing u-turns in front of oncoming traffic and blocking private driveways. All of this behaviour and more is unacceptable.

The police are asking all road users to take greater care in and around school zones. If you are dropping off or collecting children please leave yourself adequate time to find a parking spot so that you can safely attend to your children.

Over the coming weeks Police will be patrolling these areas and will show a zero tolerance to any offending. Please for the welfare of everyone, take care.

Please find below some common offences and their penalties which police will be targeting;

Fail to stop and remain stationary at children's crossing	\$413	3 points
Parking Offences	\$33 - \$165	-
Use mobile phone whilst driving	\$496	4 points
Seat belt offences	\$330 - \$372	3 points

## **GOLD COIN DONATION**

The Daniel Morcombe Foundation was started in honour of Daniel Morcombe to make Australia a safer place for children. It was founded by parents Bruce and Denise after their son Daniel was abducted and murdered in December 2003 while waiting to catch a bus on the Sunshine Coast, Queensland. The aims of the Foundation are to educate children and young people about how to stay safe in physical and online environments and to support young victims of crime. Day for Daniel is Australia's largest national day of action to raise awareness of child safety, protection and prevention.

Holy Eucharist will be hosting a Wear Red for Daniel Day. Students are asked to wear red and bring a gold coin donation which will be donated to the Daniel Morcombe Foundation.

#### What can you do at home?

- · Discuss who they could talk to if they felt unsafe and what they could do
- · Practice using stories and scenarios to problem solve. Do not always make these about strangers
- · Reinforce basic safety messages and ensure children know the phone numbers of people they can call on for help or to talk to
- Explain that it is ok to say no to an adult or child if they are doing something that is not ok or makes the child feel unsafe. Let the child know they will not get into trouble if they tell you about an unsafe secret someone has asked them to keep
- Remind your child that it is always ok to talk to you, no matter what the issue, you care about them and want to help them to stay safe

## WORLD TEACHER'S **DAY 2020**


