PARENT/TEACHER CHATS

At this stage, Holy Eucharist School will be hosting our annual Parent/Teacher Chats at school on Wednesday 10th March 2021 from 12:10pm until 6:00pm. Please note that students will be finishing school at 12pm on this day. The Parent/Teacher Chats will be held on the proviso that parents/carers adhere to the current DHHS restrictions that are in place, particularly around the wearing of masks.

Parent/Teacher Chats are a great opportunity to communicate with your child's teacher and to hear about how your child has settled into their new class. However, they are also a great way to discuss any concerns or questions you may have regarding your child. It is important that you take the time to think about the things you would like to discuss with your child's teacher, to ensure you make the most of your allocated time.

The Parent/Teacher Chats will be approximately 10 minutes in length - just enough time for you and your child's teacher to meet and communicate. During this meeting, your child's teacher will be asking questions which will provide them with important information. The information gathered will assist the class teachers when planning lessons and when teaching your child. eg: your child's birthplace, date of arrival in Australia, first language/s spoken, etc.

Please remember that our school has COVID safe protocols in place in order to keep everyone safe. The Adventure Playground and the carpark gates on the school grounds will remain closed. Access to the school will only be via Gates 1, 2 and 3. During the Parent/Teacher Chats, all parents/carers and staff must:

- · Wear a facemask at all times,
 - Practice social distancing of 1.5 metres
- Keep to the density limits (I.e. 1 person per 2 square metres)

We ask that parents select their preferred time as soon as possible and to return their slips to their child's teacher without delay. If parents have more than one child at Holy Eucharist School, they are asked to add them to the same list as well.

MEDICAL SURVEY

Over a week ago, the students were given a Medical Survey. Parents were asked to complete this survey to enable us to provide you with relevant medical forms for your child (if applicable). Please note that medication can only be administered by office staff once the appropriate forms have been completed by a medical practitioner and are returned to school.

Medical surveys need to be returned without further delay.

NAPLAN 2021

This year, the students in Years 3 and 5 will be taking part in the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) on 11th, 12th and 13th May 2021.

NAPLAN is an annual assessment for all students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. It tests the types of skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life. The tests cover skills in reading, writing, spelling, grammar and punctuation, and numeracy. The assessments are undertaken every year in the second full week in May.

NAPLAN is made up of tests in the four areas (or 'domains') of:

- Reading
- Writing
- Language Conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation)
- Numeracy

COVID UPDATE

The Chief Health Officer and the 'CECV School Operations Guide' (Updated 21 January 2021) advises that all staff, parents and students to continue engaging in safe practices:

- Wash hands correctly and regularly
- Hand sanitise
- · Sneeze and cough into elbow
- It is also advised that students who display the following symptoms must not attend school:
 - fever
 - · chills or sweats
 - cough
 - sore throat shortness of breath
 - runny nose
 - loss or change in sense of smell or taste.

Some people may also experience headache, muscle soreness, stuffy nose, nausea, vomiting and diarrhoea. If a child presents at school with any of these symptoms, parents or guardians will be contacted and directed to take the child home.

Staff are to:

- Ensure high touch areas are cleaned regularly (antibacterial wipes available)
- Where possible: enhance airflow by opening windows and adjusting air conditioning
- · Wear masks indoors and outdoors except whilst teaching
- Practice social distancing of 1.5 metres
- Be aware of density limits. 1 person per 2 square metres (signage will be adjusted around the school)

All adults who are permitted onsite to carry out essential business are to:

- Wear masks indoors and outdoors
- Practice social distancing of 1.5 metres
- Be aware of density limits. 1 person per 2 square metres (signage will be adjusted around the school)

Please note, at this stage parents/carers/visitors are not permitted to enter the school grounds. The school office will only allow 2 parents to enter at any given time. Please wear a mask and use the hand sanitiser at the door before entering to the office. If parents are required to be onsite, they will need to sign the logbook, must wear mask, minimise their time and practise physical distancing.





NATIONAL ASSESSMENT PROGRAM Literacy and Numeracy

THE AUSTRALIAN GOVERNMENT CAPITAL GRANTS AND STATE CAPITAL FUND - MASTER PLAN

Towards the end of last year and over the summer holidays, I had met with staff from the Melbourne Archdiocese of Catholic Schools to look at improving the learning spaces / buildings around our school. Since then, I have completed a submission to the Australian Government Capital Grants and another submission for the State Capital Fund. Even though two submissions were completed, the school will only be eligible to receive one grant if successful.

The Australian Government Capital Grants and State Capital Fund submissions require schools to submit a Master Plan. Therefore, I had appointed MINX Architecture on behalf of the school to design a Master Plan that is tailored to the needs of our school community.

In order to keep up with the increasing enrolments, I put forward the notion that the school is desperate need of new classrooms. I had suggested that Stage 1 of the Master Plan included 8 new learning spaces to be built next to the MacKillop Building. The building will need to be a 2 storey building in order to fit onto the



site. The estimated cost of the new classrooms will be around \$4M. Please note that in order for the school to be successful in the submission, the school had to commit a specified amount towards the cost of Stage 1.

I have place a copy of the Master Plan in the school foyer and invite parents, carers and staff to provide some feedback and to make suggestions on the sticky notes provided. Alternatively, parents, carers and staff can provide their feedback on ClassDojo. The feedback will then be given to Minx Architects to make further improvements to the Master Plan.

Thank you in advance, for your participation in this very important endeavour in the life and future of our school. With your support and prayers we hope that we will be successful in our application.
