
Gospel: Matthew 6:1-6, 16-18 (JB)

As you all know, 2020 was an extraordinary year and we were not able to say goodbye to Mr Parker as a community, due to the COVID-19 restrictions. I thanked Mr Parker on behalf of the school community and we presented him with a small token of thanks.

On Thursday morning this week, we celebrated our Opening Mass for the school year. We were fortunate enough to celebrate Mass outside on the oval. During the celebration, the 2021 School Student Leadership Team was presented to the school community. I would like to congratulate the 12 leaders who have been chosen to represent our school. I am looking forward to supporting and working in collaboration with them this year.

Our Prep children have made a tremendous start. This week was their first full week at school. Some practices that we have introduced at the school may not be ideal, but they are there to keep everyone in our school and parish community safe and I seek your full cooperation.

All students from Prep to Grade 6 will be starting school at 8:55am and finishing at 3:15pm.

In order to utilise the outdoor space to our advantage and to continue engaging in safe practices, we have decided as a staff to keep the staggered recess and lunch breaks. DESIGNATED GATES:

Each grade level will have a designated gate to enter/leave the school. These are as follows:

- Gate 1 (Next to the hall) Grade Prep and Grade 3
- Gate 2 (Next to the church) Grade 1 and Grade 4
- Gate 3 (Admin gate) Grades 6
- Gate 4 (O'Brien Drive) Grade 2 and Grade 5

Please remember:

In the morning gates will be open from 8:30am until 9am. (Please remember the 1.5 metre physical distancing rule)

•At this stage, parents/carers are not permitted to enter the school grounds.

•In the afternoon gates will be open from 3:15pm until 3:45pm. (Please remember the 1.5 metre physical distancing rule)

All classroom teachers will be in their rooms in the morning at 8:45am. The classroom teacher will take the students to the gate at home time (3:15pm) and will wait for students to be picked up. If you have more than one child at school, you can drop off and pick up your children from a preferred gate, so long as you have one child who belongs to the year level specified at the gate. Please note that the same gate must be used at pick up time.

COVID UPDATE

The Chief Health Officer and the 'CECV School Operations Guide' (Updated 21 January 2021) advises that all staff, parents and students to continue engaging in safe practices:

- · Wash hands correctly and regularly
- Hand sanitise
- Sneeze and cough into elbow

It is also advised that students who display the following symptoms must not attend school:

• fever

• chills or sweats

• cough

sore throat

shortness of breath

- runny nose
- loss or change in sense of smell or taste.

Some people may also experience headache, muscle soreness, stuffy nose, nausea, vomiting and diarrhoea. If a child presents at school with any of these symptoms, parents or guardians will be contacted and directed to take the child home.

Staff are to:

- Ensure high touch areas are cleaned regularly (antibacterial wipes available)
- Where possible: enhance airflow by opening windows and adjusting air conditioning
- Carry masks, which are to be used, when physical distancing cannot be maintained
- Practice social distancing of 1.5 metres when able (or wear a mask)
- Be aware of density limits. 1 person per 2 square metres (signage will be adjusted around the school)
- Wear a mask whilst doing Before and After School Duty and bringing children to the gates.

All adults who are permitted onsite to carry out essential business are to:

- Wear a mask when onsite, when physical distancing cannot be maintained
- Practice social distancing of 1.5 metres.
- Be aware of density limits. 1 person per 2 square metres (signage will be adjusted around the school)

Please note, at this stage parents/carers/visitors are **not permitted to enter the school grounds**. The school office will only allow 2 parents to enter at any given time. Please wear a mask and use the hand sanitiser at the door before entering to the office. If parents are required to be onsite, they will need to sign the logbook, must wear mask, minimise their time and practise physical distancing.

SCHOOL NURSE PROGRAM 2021

All Prep children received an envelope from the Primary School Nursing Program - State Government. This envelope contains a questionnaire about your child's health and development. This questionnaire is distributed to all Victorian children enrolled in their first year

The questionnaire enables you to raise any concerns you may have regarding your child's health and development. Parents are asked to complete the questionnaire, sign it and return it back to the teacher, sealed in the envelope by Friday 19th February 2021. The school nurse will be visiting the school in March.

ASSESSMENT PORTFOLIOS

All students at Holy Eucharist School have an Assessment Portfolio. This portfolio enables teachers to have a consistent approach throughout the school in collecting data and evidence of your child's work.

This Assessment Portfolio will be sent home at the beginning and at the end of each term.

At the beginning of each term the folder will contain a Term Outline.

Term Outline

- The Term Outline has a summary of what is going to be covered in your child's year level, across all curriculum
- The Term Outline will go home at the **beginning** of each term inside the Assessment Portfolio and **parents** will be required to read and sign the sheet. The Term Outline needs to be returned to school inside the Assessment Portfolio.



At the end of each term the folder will contain Work Samples (evidence).

- Throughout the term, teachers will collect samples of your child's work. These samples are collected as evidence of your child's achievements and as an indication of what has been taught.
- The samples collected should also correlate with what has been documented on the Term Outline sheet.
- The work samples are corrected by the teacher and should have relevant comments to support what the student has achieved.

Parents are invited to look through the Assessment Portfolio with their child. Parents are requested to write positive comments in the space provided (on the yellow cover sheet) and to sign it.

Term outlines/Assessment Portfolios will go home (Friday 19th February) and need to be returned by Wednesday 24th February.

Unfortunately, due to the COVID restrictions, we are unable to have our Family School picnic this year.

SCHOOL PHOTOS

School Photos will be taken on Monday 1st March 2021. All students need to wear their full Summer Uniform and black school shoes. In the coming weeks, each student will be given individual order forms. If you would like to order photos, you will need to fill in the order form, pay the correct amount and return it to your class teacher on **photo day.** Alternatively, you can order photos online up to 2 days after photo day. Please note that cash orders will not be accepted.



The Canteen is now open. The operator at the Canteen has put together a new healthier menu which we will be closely monitoring. If the students need to go to the Canteen they will be required to keep their distance and will need to stand on the markings on the floor. Please note: Students are not permitted to order their lunch in the morning at the canteen window.

Students need to prepare their lunch orders at home and to place them in the lunch order boxes in their classrooms.
