RELIGION

<u>Unit:</u> Right Relationships (Reconciliation) Understandings:

- God has given us free will to make choices, and these choices can affect others.
- Christians are invited to develop relationships based on respect and valuing individual differences.
- There is a need to forgive and be forgiven.
- The Sacrament of Penance provides us with an opportunity to be forgiven.
- God's healing and forgiving love is realised in the actions and words of Jesus.
- We can recognise Jesus in ourselves through Scripture and the choices we make.

Unit: LENT AND EASTER_ Understandings:

- Understandings:
 - Lent is a season when Christians think about the way Jesus Christ gave himself to others.
 - We can follow Jesus Christ by being loving and giving of ourselves.
 - During Lent, groups and individuals share what they have to bring hope to others.
 - During Holy Week and Easter, Christians remember and celebrate that Jesus shared the gift of himself in his Last Supper, in his death and in the resurrection.
 - The symbols, signs, actions and rituals of Holy Week and Easter remind us of the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

ENGLISH

Reading and Viewing

Your child will be:

- reading a variety of texts and identifying their language features and structure;
- drawing connections between personal experiences and the world using a variety of text types;
- identifying the audience and purpose of a text;
- using comprehension strategies to build literal and inferential meaning;
- evaluating texts by drawing on their growing knowledge of context, text structures and language features;
- exposed to new vocabulary through classroom discussions and shared reading experiences.

Writing

Your child will be:

- developing an understanding of spelling rules;
- exposed to strategies and skills to assist them in planning and writing fictitious and factual texts;
- planning, drafting and publishing texts demonstrating their understanding of text structures, language features and purpose;
- rereading and editing texts for meaning, appropriate structure, grammatical choices and punctuation;
- practising their handwriting using Victorian pre-cursive letters so that letters are correctly formed and consistent in size.

Speaking and Listening

Your child will be:

- encouraged to speak clearly and share their thoughts and ideas in pairs, group work and whole class discussions;
- encouraged to listen actively and take turns in small or large-group contexts;
- encouraged to orally answer questions in complete sentences;
- learning how language can be used to express feelings and opinions on topics;
- rehearsing and delivering short presentations on familiar and new topics, using a clear and appropriate speaking voice, tone, volume and pace.

MATHEMATICS

Your child will be:

- developing their skills with identifying and writing up to 4-digit numbers;
- encouraged to apply their knowledge of place value up to 4-digit numbers;
- comparing and ordering up to 4-digit numbers;
- completing number patterns that increase and decrease by 1, 10, 100 or 1000;
- developing their understanding of the meaning of terms such as 'sum' and 'difference' and the connection between them;
- recalling addition facts for single-digit numbers and related subtraction facts to develop efficient mental strategies for computation;
- using effective mental and written strategies to solve computations and word problems.

INTEGRATED STUDES - INQUIRY

Topic: Our Shared History

Learning Area: History and Geography

Big Question: How have different cultural groups shaped/changed Australia? Understandings:

- Country and place are significant to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.
- Australians have diverse backgrounds and these have all contributed to creating a diverse country.
- Indigenous Australians were the first inhabitants of the land.
- Indigenous Australians and settlers had different perspectives during "First Contact".
- Our community has changed after the arrival of the first settlers some features have been lost (e.g. Indigenous culture, connection to and respect of the land) and some features have been retained (e.g. technology, agriculture).
- Cultures are defined by their unique music, languages, traditions, clothing, food, celebrations and religions and these are present in Australia.
- Many people chose to settle in Australia because of the social, religious and political context at the time.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Your child will be:

- learning how to demonstrate fair play when participating in physical activities;
- practising a range of fundamental motor skills, such as learning the correct technique in throwing and catching a Frisbee and the basic rules for a Frisbee game;
- participating in physical activities which require problem-solving in order to achieve a goal.

THE ARTS

Visual Arts Your child will be:

- learning about Aboriginal culture and art, and recognising both traditional and contemporary use of colours and symbols;
 - identifying the meaning of symbols and how these are used in Aboriginal Art for storytelling;
 - creatively designing and using symbols to tell their own story via their artwork.

Music

Your child will be:

- understanding minims and dotted minims;
- understanding dynamics (loud and soft);
- learning the vocabulary of Dynamics;
- creating basic compositions using crotchets, quavers, and minims;
- creating basic compositions using dynamic notation;
- learning the song 'Mother Mountain' with Indigenous language.

LOTE - Language Other Than English

Chinese – Mandarin

Your child will be:

- learning about the culture and customs of the Lunar New Year;
- matching characters to the meanings and sounds of familiar words, such as animals;
- recognising Chinese Zodiac characters and the difference between the Oriental and Western calendar;
- writing Chinese numbers/pinyin (1-12) that match the zodiac characters.
