> GOSPEL Mark 11:1-10 A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

When Jesus and his disciples were on their way to Jerusalem they came near the Mount of Olives.

Jesus said to two of his disciples, "Go into the village straight ahead of you. As soon as you enter it, you will find a colt that is tied to a post. Untie it and bring it to me. If anyone says to you, "Why are you doing that?' say, "The Lord needs it now, but he will bring it back to you.""

ASSESSMENT PORTFOLIOS

Today you will receive your child's Assessment Portfolio containing samples of work completed during Term 1.

We, the staff at Holy Eucharist recognise that in order for our students to be successful in school, they need the support and guidance from both the home and the school community. We know a strong partnership with you will make a great difference in your child's education.

Therefore, we ask for **your co-operation and support** by looking carefully at the Assessment Portfolio with your child.

- Encourage them to talk about what they were required to do for each piece.
- Discuss what they have achieved. If there are areas which need improvement, discuss with your child what they could do to improve.

As partners, we share the responsibility for our children's success and want you to know that we will do our very best to carry out our responsibilities.

This Assessment Portfolio contains:

- <u>Term 1 Outline sheet</u>. This provides the parent/guardian with a summary of what has been covered during this term in all curriculum areas. The term outline went home at the beginning of this term (inside the portfolio) and you were invited to sign it and return it to school inside the Portfolio.
- <u>Work samples.</u>These were collected by the teacher as evidence of what has been taught during term 1. These samples support what has been documented in the term outline. The work samples have been corrected by the teacher and have relevant comments to support what your child has achieved.
- The teachers have a put a lot of effort and have worked extremely hard to put these Assessment Portfolios together. You (the parent/guardian) are encouraged to make <u>comments</u> (on the yellow cover sheet provided) after looking at your child's work. Please <u>sign</u> the cover sheet inside the folder as an indication that you have seen your child's work.

STUDENTS ARRIVING LATE TO SCHOOL

Too many students are arriving late to School. School starts at 8.55am.

Parents, it is very important that you ensure your child/ren arrive at school before 8.55am. When students are late, it disrupts the classroom teacher and distracts the students from learning. We would appreciate your efforts and cooperation in this matter.

CHILDREN ARRIVING TO SCHOOL EARLY IN THE MORNING:

Staff have noticed that parents/carers are dropping off children before 8.00am and leaving them by themselves. Students who arrive early to school are **not supervised** at this time. <u>Teachers commence Yard Duty at 8:30am</u>. If for any reason you are required to drop off your child/ren before 8.30am, we strongly suggest you register with



If for any reason you are required to drop off your child/ren before 8.30am, we strongly suggest you register with Camp Australia to ensure that your child/ren are safe. We do not recommend leaving your child/ren unsupervised outside school grounds. CHILDREN NOT PICKED UP ON TIME AFTER SCHOOL

There are a number of students who are not picked up on time after school. Some students are still at school at 3:45 – 4.00pm. This is not acceptable. Supervision is until 3.30pm which gives ample time for the pickup of all students. We have no option but to now record the names of students picked up after 3.30pm.

PARKING

Brimbank City Council have placed new signage around the school (i.e. Chedgey Drive, Oleander Drive, Hibiscus Ave and O'Brien Drive). Please be vigilant when parking around the school premises. I urge you to take note of the parking restrictions, as there have been many complaints from parents and carers who are receiving fines. The school is unable to pay the fines for you so please obey the parking signs in the area to avoid infringements. The parking situation around the school is not ideal and we are working closely with the Brimbank City Council to improve the drop off and

pick up areas around the school. I thank you in advance for your understanding and cooperation in this matter.

No Parking Signs

If there is a 'no parking' sign, you can stop for 2 minutes in that area if:

- You are picking up or dropping off passengers or goods
- You stay within 3 metres of your vehicle.

If you stop in, or partly in an area showing a no parking sign and you are not picking up or dropping off passengers or goods, <u>you are considered to be parked and can be fined.</u> This is the case <u>even if you stay in your vehicle</u>.

No Stopping Signs

If there is a 'no stopping' sign, you are not allowed to stop or park your car in, or partly in, that area for any reason. Dropping off or picking up passengers or goods in a 'no stopping' area is not permitted.

NAPLAN 2021

National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) will take place on 11th, 12th and 13th May 2021. Students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 will be taking part as it tests the types of skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life. The tests cover skills in reading, writing, spelling, grammar and punctuation, and numeracy. Please refer to previous Newsletters for further information.

We already have a number of enquiries at the office from new families who wish to enrol their child for Grade Prep in 2022.


It is really important that our current parents register their child/ren at the office if they wish to enrol them for Grade Prep in 2022.

THE AUSTRALIAN EARLY DEVELOPMENT CENSUS (AEDC)

On 4th May 2021 our school will be taking part in the Australian Early Development Census (AEDC). This census is a nationwide census of early childhood development and helps schools and communities understand how children are developing before they start school, what is being done well, and what can be improved. The AEDC is an Australian Government initiative run by the Department of Education and Training. The AEDC highlights what is working well and what needs to be improved or developed to support children and their families by providing evidence to support health, education and community policy and planning.

The AEDC is held every three years and involves teachers of children in their first year of full-time school completing a research tool, the Australian version of the Early Development Instrument. The Instrument consist of about 100 questions and collects data relating to five key areas of early childhood development referred to as 'domains', these include:

- Physical health and well being
- Social competence ٠
- Emotional maturity
- Language and cognitive skills (school-based)
- Communication skills and general knowledge



Data is collected for individual children and reported for groups of children at a community, state/territory and national level. Please note that the AEDC is voluntary and is not a school test, so should you wish for your child/children's information to be excluded from the census, please contact Mr Bonnici.

HEAD LICE

The school was informed by a parent that their child had head lice. It is common for young children to get head lice particularly at school. Anyone can get head lice including adults. We encourage parents to check their child's head and hair carefully and regularly. Pharmacies have lotions and shampoos to treat head lice.

Our School Uniform Policy states that 'Hair which is shoulder length or longer must be tied back at all times'.

LEARNING AND TEACHING NEWS

PLANNING FOR TERM 2

Teachers have spent a day this week preparing and planning for learning in Term 2. Each year level will be focusing on a science based topic investigating various aspects of Biological Science including life cycles, mini beasts, living and nonliving things, being healthy and active. Stay tuned for news on what children are learning next term.

TESTING

Throughout this term the teachers have completed a number of tests with all students from Prep to Year 6. This has helped them to gain valuable information about students' reading, spelling, writing and Mathematics skills.

Teachers have listened to each child read one on one and taken running records of the reading. This has helped identify the accuracy of reading and allowed the teachers to calculate the level that students are reading at. Furthermore, teachers have gained an insight into how each child comprehends what they read. This is extremely important to know as reading is more than just being able to say each word correctly. It's about understanding the content, identifying the author's purpose for writing the text and making connections about what is read on a personal level. All of the information gathered has helped teachers focus on teaching more specifically the skills and strategies needed to continue improving reading outcomes for all students.

To measure the accuracy and spelling knowledge of students in Years 2 to Year 6, students have completed a Spelling Test. This has helped identify the types of words, letter patterns and how accurately students are able to attempt to spell unknown words, including longer words with multiple syllables.

For the students in Prep, Year 1 and Year 2, teachers have gathered information on students' knowledge of letter names and the most common sound made when in a word.

In terms of Mathematics, Teachers have used Learning Framework in Number as a tool to measure student learning in P-6 related to arithmetic. For example, teachers have gathered knowledge of students' ability to count forward and backward, number word sequences, identifying numbers, understanding of strategies such as counting by both ones and in groups. Teachers will continue to use this information to support student progress.

TAKE HOME READERS

Reading is the key to learning. It is important because it develops the mind. It is how we discover new things, It helps to develop the imagination. In order to support students at Holy Eucharist and keep them reading and learning at home, your child should be bringing home their 'Take Home Book' each afternoon. Your child/children have the privilege of borrowing books from the school's 'Take Home Collection'. Some year levels have also allocated students with login details for the digital reading platform Epic.

This is an integral part of our school reading program. All children are expected to read every night at home and complete the record of reading. Happy reading everyone!

LIBRARY BOOKS

Library borrowing is up and running. A timetable has been created to allow all classes access to the library. All classes have been getting into the library and students have been happily borrowing. It has great to hear the buzz and see students' enthusiasm to be in the library. I am certain that students don't need reminding about the privilege of borrowing and the responsibility that goes with this. Parents please remind your child/children to enjoy reading the borrowed book at home and that it is their responsibility to look after and return it (in their library bag) each week on the allocated day for library. A big thank you to Mrs Bistricki, our librarian, for an amazing looking library.
