Jesus said to his disciples,


"Here is another example of what the kingdom of God is like: it is like a mustard seed. A mustard seed is the smallest of all seeds.

### Principal's Message:

Dear Families and Friends,

I would like to thank you for your patience whilst the school was closed over the past 2 weeks due to the lockdown restrictions. I am pleased to report that all our students and staff did an amazing job during remote learning in light of this situation. I am also very proud to say that our very resilient students came back to school reenergized and with great enthusiasm to learn.

As you are aware, we are living in a COVID world. COVID is still around and continues to disrupt our lives. This means that we will need to continue doing things differently at home, at school and in the community. Some practices that we have introduced here at the school since COVID may not be ideal, but they are there to keep everyone in our school community safe and I seek your full cooperation. For the time being, we are asking parents/carers to drop off and pick-up students at the gates. This is only a temporary measure until further restrictions are lifted.

Recently, the government has made it mandatory for all schools across Victoria to have registered QR Codes available for visitors to use in addition to signing into the school. The new QR Codes have been placed on the windows outside each classroom and in the Administration Building. It is also going to become mandatory for all staff in schools to use the QR Codes as well as in all other Victorian workplaces. This service by the government assists contact tracers to contain a COVID-19 outbreak. I ask that all parents/carers use these QR Codes when permitted to come back onsite, particularly when visiting your child's classroom (i.e., Parent/Teacher Interviews) or when entering the school office.

On a lighter note, I would like to mention that during our lockdown we had 2 more people join our staff. Mrs Anita Bison has come back to us (from retirement) on a part time basis. She will be providing extra support in the Junior school and will be supporting our graduate teachers. We also welcome Mr Dion Xuereb who will be replacing Miss Faraj in Grade 3, whilst Miss Faraj takes on her new role as Digital Technologies/ICT Leader at the school. I also would like to take this opportunity on behalf of everyone at Holy Eucharist, to say farewell to Ms Allison Borg who will officially start her maternity leave as of next week. I would like to wish Allison and her partner Joe all the very best.

### **COVID-19 UPDATE**

As you are aware, the coronavirus pandemic continues to challenge us in education, so we have had to keep some safety measures in place. Since last year, we have had hand santiser accessible in all classrooms. Students and staff are required to sanitise their hands when entering a room and upon leaving the classroom. All rooms are disinfected with spray twice daily and electronic devices are wiped down with antibacterial wipes. Teaching staff have been provided with disinfectant spray bottles and rolls of paper which are to be used to clean and santise workspaces.

Social distancing is an essential element of stopping the transmission of COVID-19. This must be adhered to once more with the return of COVID-19 in the local community.

The Government has listed sites identified as potential transmission locations. Any staff or student who have been at one of the sites at the identified times must follow COVID testing procedures. Any person who has any symptoms of cold or flu must not attend school. Stay home, get tested and if the test result is negative then returning to school is possible.

QR Codes have been placed on the windows outside each classroom and in the Administration Building. It is becoming mandatory for all staff and visitors to use the QR Codes provided to assist with any contact tracing.

We must all play our part in limiting the spread of COVID-19 in the community now that it has returned. If we work together and follow all of the safety precautions we can once again manage the Corona Virus.

### STARTING AND FINISHING TIMES.

All classroom teachers will be in their rooms at 8:45am and school will begin at 8:55am. However, we will be having staggered finishing times until the end of Term 2. The finishing times are as follows:

- Grades 3, 4, 5, and 6 will finish school at 3:05pm
- Preps, 1s and 2s will finish at 3:15pm

### Please note:

- Students in Grades 3, 4, 5 and 6 will be allowed to pick up their younger brother or sister in Grade Prep, 1 and/or 2 at 3:05
- If the Grade Prep, 1 and 2 students do not have and older sibling, then they will be taken to their allocated gate by the teacher for dismissal at 3:15pm and will wait for the students to be picked up.

### **DESIGNATED GATES:**

Each grade level has a designated gate to enter/leave the school.

- Gate 1 (Next to the hall) Grade Prep and Grade 3
- Gate 2 (Next to the church) Grade 1 and Grade 4
- Gate 3 (Admin gate) Grades 6
- Gate 4 (O'Brien Drive) Grade 2 and Grade 5

### Please remember:

- In the morning the gates will be open from 8:30am until 9am.
- Students will need a late pass after 9:15am
- In the afternoon gates will be open from 3:05pm until 3:30pm.
- At this stage, parents/carers/visitors are not permitted to enter the school grounds.
- You will need to wear a mask outdoors if you cannot maintain the 1.5 metre physical distancing rule.
- If you have more than one child at school, you can drop off and pick up your children
  from a preferred gate, so long as you have one child who belongs to the year level
  specified at the gate.
- Students will need to use the same gate during drop off and pick-up time.

### **STUDENTS WHO ARE UNWELL**

- Do not double park. Even if it is for a few seconds.
- Only those persons with DISABLED stickers are permitted to park in the disabled parking bays at front of school.
- Do not park on people's nature strips.

### ENGLISH AS AN ADDITIONAL LANGUAGE (EAL)

The Department of Education with the Victorian Curriculum and Assessment Authority have released a revised version of the English as an Additional Language Curriculum. This curriculum is not inferior to the English Victorian Curriculum. It has been devised in order to provide students that speak a language other than English the best opportunity to develop their English in what is called modes - Speaking and Listening, Reading and Viewing and Writing. This revised version is being implemented in all Department, Catholic and Independent schools this year. As a result, teachers at Holy Eucharist have examined the information collected from you during Parent Teacher interviews at the beginning of the year, to decide which curriculum would best suit students' needs. Therefore, a number of students will now be following an EAL pathway and they will receive an EAL report to assess their Literacy skills. Teachers will advise you if this is the case. Please do not be alarmed. I reiterate, this curriculum is not inferior! Literacy is still taught in the same way but with more of an emphasis on developing proficiency/skills/knowledge, such as understanding grammar, learning new vocabulary, speaking correctly in full sentences etc.
