As you are aware by now, the State Government announced late yesterday afternoon that the entire state of Victoria will go into a "Snap Lockdown". As a result, Holy Eucharist School will not be open Friday 6th August, Monday 9th August, Tuesday 10th August, Wednesday 11th August and Thursday 12th August 2021. However, we will provide on-site supervision from 8:55am to 3:15pm for students who meet the criteria listed by the government (please see the following pages). It is unfortunate that we have had to postpone/cancel so many events again, however we must adhere to the restrictions imposed by the Government in order to keep everyone in the community safe. I will continue to keep you informed of any changes that may occur in the future.

On a more positive note, we have lots of exciting news to share with you! During lockdown 5.0 Ms Allison Borg gave birth to a baby boy. Mum, dad and baby Alex are doing well. On behalf of everyone at Holy Eucharist I would like to wish Allison and her partner Joe all the very best.

Last week we welcomed back Ms Tamara Patel to our school. She has been appointed to work for 3 days per week in Grade 5 C/S. Ms Patel will be sharing the class with Mrs Shaw for the remainder of this year. At the beginning of this year Miss Christie was appointed as Family and Community Engagement Leader. Due to the growing demand of this role particularly during lockdown, Miss Christie is now released fulltime from the classroom. Miss Christie will also be assisting with Grade Prep and Grade 6 transition.

A big thank you again to all parents and carers who participated in Parent Support Group (PSG) discussions over the last few weeks. At Holy Eucharist we recognise the importance of working in collaboration with our families. For students with diverse needs, these partnerships between family and school are crucial in supporting our student. COVID-19 UPDATE - SNAP LOCKDOWN

The State Government announced late yesterday afternoon that we will go into a SNAP LOCK DOWN until Thursday 12th August 2021. These restrictions have been put in place to prevent the spread of the COVID-19 Delta strain.

As a result, Holy Eucharist School will not be open on Friday 6th August, Monday 9th August, Tuesday 10th August, Wednesday 11th August and Thursday 12th August 2021. However, we will provide on-site supervision from 8:55am to 3:15pm ONLY for students in the following categories:

- Children whose parents are considered authorised workers as listed by the Victorian Government (*Please visit* <u>https://www.coronavirus.vic.gov.au/authorised-provider-and-authorised-worker-list</u>), children whose parents cannot work from home and where no other supervision arrangements can be made.
- Vulnerable children, including children in out-of-home care, children deemed by Child Protection and/or Family Services to be at risk of harm and children identified by the school as vulnerable (including via referral from a family violence agency, homelessness or youth justice service or mental health or other health service).
- (NB: These students will need to enter/leave the school via the Administration Gate only).

If your circumstances fit the above categories and you require your children to be at school on any day from Friday 6th August to Thursday 12th August 2021, please send a message to Mr Bonnici via ClassDojo or an email to <u>principal@hestalbanssth.catholic.edu.au</u>. Please include your phone number so that we can call you to make the arrangements for school supervision. Alternatively, you can call the school office during business hours on 83120900.

Please re-assure your children that they are safe and that we will soon be back at school doing all the things we love. I will continue to communicate further details with you via ClassDojo and the School Website. Please keep checking these for any updates.

CATHOLIC EDUCATION COMMISSION OF VICTORIA (CECV): SCHOOL OPERATIONS GUIDE

The CECV provide all Catholic Schools in Victoria with a 'School Operations Guide'. This guide is regularly updated so that schools know what they can and cannot do to remain safe. Since the pandemic, the 'School Operations Guide' has been updated weekly and sometimes daily, depending on the advice given by the government. Some practices that we have introduced at the school may not be ideal, but they are there for a reason, that is, to keep everyone in our school and wider community safe.

I have attached a page which was published in the latest 'School Operations Guide' to demonstrate why some of things we love to do at school, such as Sacraments, camps, swimming, excursions, incursions, interschool sports, etc, have had to be cancelled/rescheduled. I am sure you can appreciate the predicament we are in at the moment! We are currently trying our best to re-book camp venues, swimming lessons and excursions for our students. Hopefully there will be an availability at these venues before the end of this year.

POTENTIAL TRANSMISSION LOCATIONS

The Government has listed sites identified as potential transmission locations. Any staff or student who have been at one of the sites at the identified times must follow COVID testing procedures. Any person who has any symptoms of cold or flu must not attend school. Stay home, get tested and if the test result is negative then returning to school is possible.

QR CODES

The use of Service Victoria QR codes for electronic record keeping is mandatory for all schools to enable the effective contact tracing of any COVID-19 cases. The public health intent of including schools in the QR code check-in system for workplaces is to capture those visitors accessing school buildings or indoor facilities, but not those entering the school grounds for reasons such as school pick-up. QR codes will be required to be used by:

- all visitors, including contractors, Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools (MACS) and other external staff, and building and maintenance staff
- all parents who enter buildings when on the school site. QR code check-ins will not be required for staff or students, or parents who come onto school grounds for drop-off or pick-up, but do not enter buildings.

Schools can permit parents to enter buildings on site for student pick-up and drop-off, provided that parents/carers use the QR codes provided (*Please note that this all depends on the restrictions*)

QR Codes can be found:

- > On the window next to the door of each classroom
- On all site entry and exit points
- > On all building entrances.

Our school already has in place a signing-in and signing-out process at the office. We will continue to use this process to record all visitor attendance onsite.

We must all play our part in limiting the spread of COVID-19 in the community now that it has returned. If we work together and follow all of the safety precautions we can once again manage the Coronavirus.

NAPLAN ONLINE

At the end of last term, I received notification that our school will be doing NAPLAN online next year. In order to prepare for this, students in Year 3 and Year 5 will be participating in the School Readiness Test (SRT). The SRT will be held from 23rd August to 1st November 2021. The SRT contains two tests: a writing test and an omnibus test with questions from the reading, conventions of language and numeracy test domains. More information about this will be sent home soon.

MACS POLICIES

In 2021, Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools (MACS) became the new governor and operator of Catholic schools in the Archdiocese of Melbourne. MACS is now responsible for developing and formulating policies that ensure schools are aligned with the vision, mission and strategic direction of Catholic education. The parish priest and school principal hold distinctive roles of leadership in their parish and school communities, and

therefore it is essential that they work collaboratively to ensure that the relationship between parish and school is central to providing the religious leadership necessary for the success of the mission (Working Together in Mission, p. 1).

At the request of the Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools Ltd (MACS) board, our governing body, Holy Eucharist School is establishing a School Advisory Council to support the Principal, Parish Priest and leadership team of the school. No particular expertise is required except a desire to represent and give voice to the parent body in advising the principal about important matters particularly related to the school's ongoing desire to provide the best possible education for our children.

MELBOURNE ARCHDIOCESE CATHOLIC SCHOOLS – SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT SURVEYS (MACSSIS)

Throughout each year, we pause to listen to our students, families and staff to gauge how our learning community is travelling. This feedback is invaluable to our progress as effective school communities and is backed by evidence-based research and best practices.

A significant and formal way in which we engage and gather data is through MACSSIS, the Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools – School Improvement Surveys. One of the main goals of the MACSSIS survey is to identify the strengths and areas for improvement within our school. We believe it is important that you have a voice in order to contribute to shaping the ongoing improvement of Holy Eucharist School.

The survey will be accessible online, from Monday 30th August and will need to be completed by Friday 17th September 2021. The survey will be available in English and in various other languages and dialects. All participation is invited, welcomed and 100% voluntary. The surveys are not a test; they are an inclusive way to inform the work we are already doing to improve our school. Everyone has the right to refuse to participate, or withdraw from the survey at any point before, during, or after completion of the survey. NEW LECTERN AND PASCHAL CANDLE

The Paschal candle (which is also usually found inside a church) is a symbol of Jesus Christ, who is "the light of the world" (John 8:12). Feelings and Emotions

Emotional skills include being able to recognise, express, understand and manage a wide range of feelings. These skills are important for a child's ability to learn to interact successfully with others and the world around them.

Children who can understand and manage their feelings, stay calm and enjoy their experiences, are more likely to develop a positive sense of self and be better equipped to learn at school.

Children develop emotional skills through their relationships with the important people in their lives. They learn to manage their emotions and feelings by observing how others respond and how those important people react and respond to them.

Here are some ways to help your child manage his or her emotions:

- Soothe your child when they are upset. Be warm, caring and responsive to your child.
- Model effective ways to manage feelings e.g. "I'm feeling upset, I just need some time to calm down." Show your child that having difficult feelings is part of everyday life
- Encourage your child to talk about their feelings and to help them to explain why they are feeling that way. Problem solve ways to become calm and move on to more pleasant activities.
- Talk about feelings in every day conversations. Name feelings in yourself and others, not just focusing on feelings of sadness and anger, but also happiness, surprise and being excited. Link emotions to behaviours that occur during every day experiences e.g. ask your child how they felt when a particular thing happened.
- Try to understand the meaning of your child's behaviour and respond accordingly
- Teach children to consider the feelings of others e.g. show them how to comfort a child who has fallen over.

Shared book reading is also a great way to teach your child about feelings and emotions. Here are some tips for reading together:

- Encourage your child to think about how a character in the story might be feeling and why.
- Ask your child open ended questions to encourage him or her to connect with the story on a deeper level e.g. "Why does the boy feel sad?"
- Discuss with your child what the character could do calm down or feel better.
- Study the facial expressions of the characters and describe how they might be feeling by the way they look e.g. down turned lips indicate sad or upset; furrowed brow indicates confused or angry. Both you and your child could copy these facial expressions in the mirror.
- Link characters' emotions to your child's previous experiences e.g. "Remember the time when you fell over, you felt sad. What did we do to make you feel better? Do you think that would help the character in the story to feel better too?"
- Re-enact the story! Children gain a more sophisticated understanding of a story by acting it out.
