Some **verbs** are used with the main verb to give us an idea of the degree to which something might happen. They tell us the level of certainty or probability of something happening.

The text on page 32 shows three levels of certainty:

Willy might jump. (Willy is thinking about jumping so this is low certainty.)

Willy **should** jump. (Willy hears a rumbling so his thoughts about jumping have increased to a medium level of certainty.)

Willy **must** jump. (Willy needs to jump to escape the rampaging razorbacks, so jumping has become a certainty.) The verbs *might*, *should* and *must* are called **modal verbs**.

Modal verbs are auxiliary (helping) verbs.



Some adverbs can be modal adverbs. **Modal adverbs** can be used with verbs to add a degree of certainty or possibility. For example:

Perhaps you dropped your wallet. It seems likely. He definitely needs a new wallet.

Perhaps, likely and definitely are modal adverbs, because they tell us more about what is possible or certain.

THE RULES


- You are only <u>ALLOWED</u> to use a paper plate and a pair of scissors.
