

Father's Day: Faith Reflection for Sunday 5th September 2021

NAPLAN REPORTS

The Year 3 and Year 5 NAPLAN reports arrived at school on Tuesday. However, we have decided that we will hold onto to these until the student return onsite. Despite all the lockdowns and remote learning last year and earlier this year, the data demonstrates that most of our students have made significant growth in the areas of Reading, Writing and Numeracy. I would like to congratulate our students and our dedicated teachers and staff for their perseverance and hard work.

Please remember that many secondary schools are now requesting a copy of the student's Year 5 NAPLAN report as well as students' Mid/End of Year report when enrolling for Year 7. It's important that parents, caregivers and students look after these reports as schools can only print a summary of the NAPLAN data (and not the full report).

POTENTIAL TRANSMISSION LOCATIONS

The Government has listed sites identified as potential transmission locations. Any staff or student who have been at one of the sites at the identified times must follow COVID testing procedures. Any person who has any symptoms of cold or flu must not attend school. Stay home, get tested and if the test result is negative then returning to school is possible.

REMOTE LEARNING PACKS:

The teaching staff will provide work for your child online via Google Classroom and Class Dojo during remote learning. Each week during remote learning, the teachers will also put together a remote learning pack for those students who cannot access the work online. These remote learning packs will be placed in tubs under the marquee outside the school office usually on Fridays after 12pm.

Please remember, before entering the Administration gate, to ensure that you are wearing a facemask and that you sanitise your hands before picking up the packs from the tubs.

Don't forget, you can also access the remote learning packs online via the school website and on Class Dojo. During remote learning your child can also do the following:

- Practise their reading,
- Work on a piece of writing,
- Draw about an experience and write about it
- Exercise outdoors and play family games.

REMOTE LEARNING - JUNIORS

During the week, I had the opportunity to visit many junior classes whilst they were online. It was wonderful to see the students' faces. I have to say that I was very impressed with the Preps, Year 1s and Year 2s who were navigating on their own (with parent supervision) whilst on Zoom.

Many of the Prep and Year 1 students participated in Show and Tell. They also observed the teachers doing lots of cooking activities. The Prep teachers made Chocolate Balls as well as Fairy Bread! When I attended the Year 1 Zoom session, the students were dressed in their favourite book character. It was also wonderful to hear the Year 2 students reading their favourite book on Class Dojo.




SCHOOL WEBSITE - UPDATED
