

RETURN TO ONSITE LEARNING:

All students will be returning to school on **Wednesday next week.** Please remember that:

- Monday 1st November is a School Closure Day Staff will use this day for Planning/Report Writing
- Tuesday 2nd November is a Public Holiday Melbourne Cup.
- Wednesday 3rd November All students will return to onsite learning at school.

DESIGNATED GATES:

Students in Grades Prep, 1 and 2 are school from 8:55am to 3:10pm. Students in Grades 3, 4, 5 and 6 are school from 8:55am to 3:15pm. Each grade level will continue to use the designated gates to enter/leave the school. The gates are as follows:

- Gate 1 (Next to the hall) Grade Prep and Grade 3
- Gate 2 (Next to the church) Grade 1 and Grade 4
- Gate 3 (Admin gate) Grade 6
- Gate 4 (O'Brien Drive) Grade 2 and Grade 5

Please remember:

•Gates will be open from 8:30am until 9am. (Please remember the 1.5 metre physical distancing rule and masks must be worn)

At this stage, parents/carers are not permitted on the school grounds.
All classroom teachers will be in their rooms in the morning at 8:45am.
The classroom teacher will take the students to the gate at home time and will wait for students to be picked up. The gates will be

open from 3:10pm until 3:45pm.

•If you have more than one child at school, you can drop off and pick up your children from a preferred gate, so long as you have one child who belongs to the year level specified at the gate. Please note that the same gate must be used at pick up time to avoid confusion

IS YOUR CHILD UNWELL?

Please remember, when your child returns to onsite learning, it is vital that **they do not come to school** if they have any of the following symptoms:

- sore throat,
- temperature,
- tiredness,
- loss of taste or smell,
- tummy pains
- shortness of breath.

If the students show any of the above symptoms they will be sent home immediately.

It is important that your emergency contact is available if, for



any reason you are unable to pick up your child if we ring you. The constant message is for all of us to be responsible in the actions we take. By keeping yourself safe, you are keeping your families, your colleagues and your friends safe.

IMPORTANT MESSAGE REGARDING COVID TESTS

This is an important message for students who are attending onsite learning and for all families once onsite learning begins. Please be reminded that if you are currently waiting for COVID test results, your child/ren CANNOT attend onsite learning until the results come back negative. This is to prevent our school from having to close down in the event that a result returns positive.

It is also essential that you notify the school immediately if you have been informed by the Department of Health that you, or a family member is COVID-19 Positive. This allows us to ensure that school's COVID Safe plan is followed which will mean that



your child will need to isolate whilst on-site.

In the event that a child needs to isolate, please be reassured that we will do so in a caring, supportive and respectful manner, prior to the child being collected and taken home. Thank you for your co-operation and for abiding by the current COVID guidelines.

GUIDELINES REGARDING FACEMASKS FOR STUDENTS AND TEACHERS

Recently, the Chief Health Officer issued instructions to all school principals throughout the State of Victoria regarding the wearing of face masks by students in primary school settings. The latest Schools Operations Guide (released on Monday 11th October) stipulates the following:

- School staff must wear face masks while teaching wherever practicable, except where removal of a face mask is necessary for effective communication.
- Students in Year 3 to Year 6 to wear face masks when indoors on school premises, unless an exception applies.
- Recommends that all other children wear face masks when at school, attending an OSHC program, or when travelling to and from school on public transport, taxis or ride share vehicles.

POTENTIAL TRANSMISSION LOCATIONS

The Government continues to list various sites which have been identified as potential transmission locations. Any staff or student who have been at one of the sites at the identified times must follow COVID testing procedures. Any person who has any symptoms of cold or flu must not attend school. Stay home, get tested and if the test result is negative then returning to school is possible.

VENTILATION IN SCHOOLS

Schools are required to increase fresh air flow into indoor spaces (including shared spaces, staff areas and thoroughfares) whenever possible and to maximise the use of outdoor learning areas or environments. Schools have been advised of the following:

Natural ventilation

Keep all windows, doors and vents open as much as possible.
 Keep these openings clear of any obstruction to air flow.

Please make sure your children bring their jumper or jacket to school – They may feel cold if the windows/doors are open.

- · Door jambs should be used to keep doors open.
- · Aim to open windows and vents that are higher or towards the ceiling during poor or windy weather.
- The use of mechanical ventilation (such as air conditioning units and heaters) with opened windows, doors and vents is encouraged to maintain a comfortable temperature and increase ventilation.
- Take measures to maintain thermal, noise and other comfort, such as flexible uniform and seating arrangements.

Mechanical ventilation

- Air recirculation should be eliminated or minimised by setting air conditioning units to use external air rather than recycling, where possible.
- Demand-controlled ventilation controls that reduce air supply based on occupancy or temperature should be disabled.
- Air conditioning filters should be maintained according to maintenance plans, checked and cleaned.
- An additional measure schools may consider to further increase the utility of mechanical ventilation, where available and practicable, is to run systems when rooms are unoccupied, and ideally two hours before and after use of a space.

Use of fans

- · Fans are only recommended to be used with other natural and mechanical methods in place.
- · Ceiling fans should be operated on the winter setting (where possible) and lowest speed.
- Other fans, such as pedestal fans, should not be directed to blow air from one person directly past another and should be set to the lowest speed.

Air Purification Devices

We are currently waiting for Air Purification Devices to arrive at school. The devices will remove potentially infectious particles – like coronavirus – from higher risk areas in schools including staffrooms, sick bays, music rooms and other high-traffic areas. Increased ventilation through the use of open windows and doors will also be used to improve air quality.

ASSESSMENT AND REPORTING - SEMESTER 2

The Semester 2 report will look a little different to Semester 1. The disruption in Semester 2 has meant that there may have been less curriculum content covered than was initially planned. Despite all of this, the teachers have used a broad evidence-base to make their own balanced assessments of your child's progress. Such evidence includes student-led conversations and teacher observations, Semester 2 assessments, notes and work samples.

Our Semester 2 reports will be in line with government requirements and will provide parents/carers with:

- a description of the areas of the Victorian Curriculum Foundation to Level 10, including Towards Foundation Levels A to D, taught;
- for English and Mathematics:
 - student achievement information represented on a continuum of learning;
 - progress made since the last time these curriculum areas were reported on;
 - a five-point scale.
 - for all other curriculum areas taught including English as an Additional Language (EAL) and Religious Education
 - student achievement information represented on a continuum of learning, progress made since the last time the curriculum areas were reported on, and a five-point scale; or
 - a short comment on progress and achievement across the semester.

More information about Assessment and Reporting will be provided in the coming weeks.
