
#### When you have completed all your work, here are some fun things to do at home.


Out of recycled items, make a musical instrument that makes a sound. Learn to play a song on your instrument. Play it for your family.	On a piece of paper, draw a maze with a start and a finish. Give your maze to a family member to solve.	Look at the dates on all of the coins in your home. Make a timeline showing all of the dates in order. Which is the oldest coin? Which is the newest coin?
Make 5 new rules you think should be added to your household. Hold a family meeting and explain each one. Then, let each member vote for their favourite!  Write a paragraph explaining the process.	Find a flower with an odd number of petals. Does this type of flower always have the same number of petals? Do some research online to find out! Write a paragraph about what you learned.	Have a family member put 10 items on a flat surface. Look at the items for 2 minutes. Walk away and list all of the items you remember. Try again using the same items. Did you do better the second time?
In your journal, make a list of 5 things you are grateful for today. They can be people, objects, or even ideas or experiences!	Using two paper towel rolls, make a pair of binoculars. Be sure to decorate them with all of the things you plan on using them for.	Count the number of jumps it takes to get from your bed to the front door. Each jump needs to be with both feet. See if a family member can beat your number of jumps!
Find your favourite stuffed toy, blanket, or pillow. In a quiet room, lie flat on your back and place the item on top of your belly button.  Breath in slowly, counting to 3. Then breathe out for 3.  Continue for 5 minutes.	Grab some painter's or masking tape and some chalk, and head outside. Create a geometric pattern on the sidewalk using tape. Then, colour in each section using a different colour. Carefully remove the tape.	Record how long it takes you to run around the perimeter of your home. Do this 5 times, recording the time after each one. Put the times in order from least to greatest. Was your first time the fastest?



#### What are Rosary Beads?

The Rosary Beads provide a method of keeping count of the different parts of the Rosary Prayer.


The fingers are moved along the beads as the prayers are said.

By not having to keep track of the count mentally, the mind is free to meditate.

The Roman Catholic Rosary is made up of a cross or crucifix, a medal, large beads and small beads.

Some sets of Rosary Beads have five groups of ten beads and other sets of Rosary Beads contain fifteen groups of ten beads.

The prayers of the Rosary can also be said using any type of counting device or by counting on the fingers.



## The Mysteries of The Rosary

The Rosary Prayer focuses on the life of Christ from the Bible.

During these prayers, people meditate on different aspects of Christ's life.

The beads of the Rosary are divided into five decades (or sections); each decade represents an event from the life of Christ.

These five events are grouped into a set of four mysteries, each focused on an important part of the life of Christ.

The four mysteries are named after the type of events in that mystery:

Joyful - The Nativity

Luminous - The Baptism of the Lord

Sorrowful - The Crucifixion

**Glorious** - The Resurrection



This year we will be learning all about The Sorrowful Mysteries.

There are five Sorrowful Mysteries. They depict certain times of sorrow in the lives of Mary and Jesus.

- **1. The Agony in the Garden** Jesus goes with his disciples to the Garden of Gethsemane to pray.
- 2. The Scourging of Jesus at the Pillar Jesus is brought to Pilate for trial.
- **3. The Crowning of Thorns** Jesus is taken by the soldiers who strip him and place a crown of thorns on his head.
- **4. The Carrying of the Cross** Jesus carried his cross to the Place of the Skull, called Golgotha in Hebrew.
- **5. The Crucifixion** Jesus is nailed to the cross.






**Did you know** that if you cut a shape into two pieces, they cannot be called halves **unless** the two pieces are **equal** (the same)?

#### **Halves are EQUAL PARTS**

All these shapes have been split into two parts. Some of them have been split in half <u>equally</u>. Some have NOT been split equally. They are not halves.


We are very lucky, because this book was written by Aunty Joy Murphy - an Aboriginal elder from our own part of Australia - from Wurundjeri country.
