
When you have completed all your work, here are some fun things to do at home.

Hide an item somewhere in your home. Draw a map leading someone to its location. Give your map to a family member to find the hidden treasure!	Lie down with the bottom of your socked feet touching the wall. Slide your feet up the wall and use them to draw 2D shapes. How many shapes can you draw before putting them down?	Write a song and create a dance about learning at home. Teach it to your family members and record yourselves performing it.
Using empty toilet paper and paper towel rolls, tape and scissors, build a cardboard marble run. Can you make one that incorporates at least one drop?	Stand in front of a ticking clock. With each tick, alternate touching your head, shoulders, knees and toes. Continue this activity for at least 2 minutes.	Have a family member help you access Google Maps on a computer. Type in your address. Try to locate these places: the closest grocery store, your school, the closest park, any rivers or lakes close by
Have an adult put a 5-metre piece of painter's or masking tape down on the floor. Put on some music and walk one foot over the other across the straight line. Can you walk on it backwards and stay on?	Look inside your refrigerator. Find 5 items that are a solid and 5 that are a liquid. In your journal, make a T-chart listing each item. What do you think would happen to each item if it was heated?	Think of a situation in nature where a plant provides shelter for an animal. Draw a picture and explain the interdependence that takes place between the two living things.
Try your hand at the ancient Japanese art of paper folding, or origami. Choose one of the animals to make. Follow the steps and see how it turns out. It may take several tries, but don't give up! 
Learning Intentions:

squares or draw dots and be imaginative.


