COVID-19 CASES AT HOLY EUCHARIST

We had to send quite a number of classes home this week after receiving notification that students had tested positive to COVID-19. The school had to call parents to pick up their child to get them tested (PCR test) for COVID-19 and to quarantine until they received a NEGATIVE result. Parents were also given Rapid Antigen Test kits to administer to their child.

When a student has attended school and later tests positive, it is our responsibility to ensure that parents/carers of other students who are then considered a 'close contact', are notified. This means that the students who have been exposed will need to get tested as soon as possible and will need to guarantine.

If the student receives a NEGATIVE result whilst in quarantine, then they will be allowed to come back to school. Parents will then need to administer the Rapid Antigen Test on their child for the next 5 days.

Students who return to school after receiving a NEGATIVE result, will need to enter the school via GATE 3 next to the office. The parents/carers will also need to provide evidence that their child has received a negative result.

IS YOUR CHILD UNWELL? IF YES...PLEASE KEEP THEM AT HOME!

Staff members and students must stay at home if they are unwell or if they may have been exposed to COVID-19. If a child stays at home because they are sick, this can prevent an entire class or the rest of the school having to quarantine.

Please remember, when your child returns to onsite learning, it is vital that **they do not come to school** if they have any of the following symptoms:

- sore throat
- temperature
- tiredness
- · loss of taste or smell
- tummy pains
- shortness of breath.

If the students show any of the above symptoms they will be sent home immediately.

It is important that your emergency contact details are up to date. It is also essential that your emergency contact person is available if, for any reason you are unable to pick up your child if we ring you.

The constant message is for all of us to be responsible in the actions we take. By keeping yourself safe, you are keeping your families, your colleagues and your friends safe.

IMPORTANT MESSAGE REGARDING COVID TESTS

Please be reminded that if you are currently waiting for COVID test results, your child/ren CANNOT attend onsite learning until the results come back negative. This is to prevent our school from having to close down in the event that a result returns positive.

It is also essential that you notify the school immediately if you have been informed by the Department of Health that you, or a family member is COVID-19 Positive. This allows us to ensure that school's COVID Safe plan is followed which will mean that your child will need to isolate whilst on-site. In the event that a child needs to isolate, please be reassured that we will do so in a caring, supportive and respectful manner, prior to the child being collected and taken home.

HOLY EUCHARIST SCHOOL IN 2021 AND 2022

The last day for Term 4, 2021 will be on Thursday 16th December 2021, at 2pm. School will resume for Term 1 in 2022 (for students), on Monday 31st January 2022. At this stage, in 2022, students in Prep, Grade 1 and Grade 2 will finish school at 3:10pm and students in Grades 3, 4, 5 and 6 will finish school at 3:15pm. All students will still be required to enter and leave the school via the designated gates. Please see below:

- 8:45am Students enter the classroom
- 8:55am Classes begin
- 3:10pm School finishes for Prep, 1 and 2 and 3:15pm for Grades 3, 4, 5 and 6

ORIENTATION DAY

I am happy to report that Orientation Day was a huge success. As I walked around to each class in the school, it was lovely to hear children and teachers getting to know each other.

A lot of preparation goes into Orientation Day. The teachers collect a significant amount of data to inform their decisions and consider each student's wellbeing when preparing class lists.

I am confident that your child will benefit from the hard work staff have put in to ensure that the needs of all students are catered for.

These class lists for 2022 have been finalised.

ASSESSMENT AND REPORTING - SEMESTER 2

The Semester 2 report will look a little different to Semester 1. The disruption in Semester 2 has meant that there may have been less curriculum content covered than was initially planned. Despite all of this, the teachers have used a broad evidence-base to make their own balanced assessments of your child's progress. Such evidence includes student-led conversations and teacher observations, Semester 2 assessments, notes and work samples.

Our Semester 2 reports will be in line with government requirements and will provide parents/carers with:

- a description of the areas of the Victorian Curriculum Foundation to Level 10, including Towards Foundation Levels A to D, taught:
- for Religious Education and Inquiry:
 - student achievement information represented on a continuum of learning;
 - progress made since the last time the curriculum areas were reported on;
- for English/EAL and Mathematics:
 - student achievement information represented on a continuum of learning:
 - progress made since the last time these curriculum areas were reported on;
 - a five-point scale.
- for Specialist Subjects, i.e. LOTE, Music, PE and Visual Arts
 - student achievement information represented on a continuum of learning;
 - progress made since the last time these curriculum areas were reported on;
 - a five-point scale for participation.

The reports will be going home on Friday 10th December together with the Assessment Envelope which will contain the samples from the Assessment Portfolio.

GRADUATION

Unfortunately, we had to postpone the Grade 6 Graduation this week due to the recent COVID outbreaks. We will now be having the Graduation Ceremony on **Tuesday 14th December 2021**. The Graduation will take place at 6pm in the Church and will be led by Fr Vincent and the Grade 6 Leaders.



It's a wonderful opportunity to celebrate the students' wonderful achievements. Due to the current restrictions, only parents/guardians of the Year 6 students (who are fully vaccinated) can attend the ceremony in the church.

SCHOOL HATS IN TERM 4

There are still quite a number of students at our school who do not have a school hat. In Australia we have "one of the highest rates of melanoma diagnoses in the world...two in three Australians will be diagnosed with skin cancer by the age of 70" (SunSmart, 2019). The good news is that almost all skin cancers are preventable. It is recommended that staff and students use a combination of sun protection measures (i.e. sun hat, sunscreen, clothing, shade and sunglasses when outdoors, avoid deliberate and extended sun exposure) when UV index levels are 3 or above (generally from mid-August to the end of April in Victoria). In Term 1 and Term 4 all students and teachers are required to wear a hat when



they are outside. It is an expectation and school policy that all students wear their school hat and their correct school uniform at all times.

VENTILATION IN SCHOOLS

Schools are required to increase fresh air flow into indoor spaces (including shared spaces, staff areas and thoroughfares) whenever possible and to maximise the use of outdoor learning areas or environments.

This week we received 24 Samsung Air Purification Devices. The devices will remove potentially infectious particles – like coronavirus – from higher risk areas in schools including high-traffic areas. Increased ventilation through the use of open windows and doors will also be used to improve air quality.

INSTALLATION OF ROAD HUMPS ON CHEDGEY DRIVE

Recently I had contacted Brimbank Council and Natalie Sulleyman MP, requesting for road humps to be installed on Chedgey Drive. Many cars are speeding along Chedgey Drive during the day whilst our children are at school. Many cars have driven into trees and street signs along the nature strip due to the speed in which they are travelling. Houses in the surrounding area will have received the following letter from the council about this. I ask for your support by contacting the council in regard to this request.

RE: Chedgey Drive, St Albans – Consideration to install Road Humps. Your feedback is important - Please email Brimbank Council

Concerns have been raised with Council regarding speeding traffic and road safety issues along Chedgey Drive, between Chestnut Drive and Mulhall Drive, abutting Holy Eucharist Primary School, St Albans.

To improve road safety and reduce vehicle speeds, Council is considering the installation of road humps along this section of Chedgey Drive. The proposed road humps will help reduce traffic speeds along this section of Chedgey Drive and will improve the overall safety of motorists and particularly school children.

The proposal may result in a road hump to be constructed in front of any property and it should be noted that road humps may require the existing lighting to be upgraded or the installation of new street lights to supplement the road humps (Please contact Michael at the school office if you wish to see the Council plan showing where the proposed road humps are to be considered).

If the proposal to install road humps is supported by a clear majority of residents, a business case will be developed detailing the proposal and submitted to Council's Capital Works Panel for funding consideration in future works programs. This does not guarantee funding, as this project will be assessed yearly on its priority compared with similar proposals across Brimbank. The installation of the road humps cannot proceed until such time as the funding is approved and included in the budget.

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
