Dear Holy Eucharist Community,

Last week, a very angry local resident confronted us at the office. He reported that parents from our school are blocking his driveway at hometime. I urge you please, not to block or park in people's driveways and to respect their private property. The residents in the neighbourhood have escalated their concerns to the local council and as a result, Brimbank Council have been patrolling the streets around the school. They have been issuing fines to people who are not obeying the law. Please remember, the school does not have the authority to cancel fines issued by the council.

On a brighter note, I would also like to congratulate our Year 5 and Year 3 students who took part in NAPLAN. The students participated enthusiasm and The NAPLAN data will be used to inform teacher practice and track student progress. This year was the first time our school participated in NAPLAN using the online portal. It has been pleasing to see that this transition occurred with ease. As mentioned in the previously, our students regularly take part in online assessments such as Pat Reading, Pat Maths and Essential Assessment Numeracy tasks. Ongoing assessment provides teachers with a more detailed and accurate picture of our students' progress which is used to target specific learning needs. We look forward to sharing the NAPLAN results with you when they arrive some time in August.

This week, our Grade 6 students finally had the opportunity to go to Camp Doxa in Malmsbury. Unfortunately, these students had missed out on camp for 2 years in a row due to the COVID-19 restrictions. The Grade 6s had a wonderful time and I would like to congratulate them for being so patient and for their behaviour whilst at camp

Finally, I would like to thank the parents/carers and staff for their attendance at the Confirmation Family Preparation Evening. I would like to reiterate that parental engagement plays an important part in your child's faith development. We were very fortunate to have Pauline Cicutto (Learning Consultant at MACs) as our guest speaker. The Grade 6 students will be receiving their Sacrament of Confirmation on Saturday 28th May 2022 at 2pm. Please remember these students in your prayers.

COVID-19 SCREENING UPDATE

RATs will continue to be distributed to you as they have been throughout this school year for the remainder of Term 2. However, from Monday 23 May 2022, we do not recommend that your child complete a RAT twice a week as previously advised.

RATs will continue to be required by students who are household contacts to attend school (five negative tests over a seven-day period) or who have symptoms.

The ongoing supply of RATs to families in our school will ensure that parents and carers have tests should they need them if their child is a household contact or has symptoms.

Families must continue to notify the Department of Health and the school if their child returns a positive RAT result. Additionally, you should inform us if any of your children are household contacts.

Thank you to all families who have gotten their child vaccinated. Vaccination continues to remain the best way to protect students and staff in our school.

Getting vaccinated is easy and bookings can be done via the Department of Health's website https://portal.cvms.vic.gov.au. If you have any questions about the vaccines, I encourage you to speak to your GP or a health practitioner.



HOUSEHOLD CONTACTS

Students who are household contacts of a COVID-19 case are not required to quarantine. They may return to school as long as they undertake rapid antigen tests (RAT) 5 times during their 7-day period. They are required to notify the school that they are a household contact. Students aged 8 years and above who are household contacts are required to wear face masks when indoors at school unless they have a valid exemption. If a student household contact returns a positive RAT result, they must isolate for 7 days.

CHILDREN ARRIVING TO SCHOOL EARLY IN THE MORNING:

There are still a number of students arriving at school before 8am. Please note that teachers commence Yard Duty at 8:30am, however there are many students arriving much earlier. Students who arrive early to school are **not supervised** at this time. We have 'Before School Care' in the hall which commences at 7am.





NAPLAN 2022

The students in Years 3 and 5 took part in the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) this week. NAPLAN is an annual assessment for students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. NAPLAN tests the sorts of skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life, such as reading, writing, spelling and numeracy.



Unfortunately, it does take some time for students to receive their NAPLAN results. Even though this is the case, please remember that all class teachers are continually assessing students' work throughout the year. Ongoing assessment provides us with a more detailed and accurate picture of our students' progress which is used to drive teaching and learning.

SEMESTER 1 REPORTS AND PARENT TEACHER INTERVIEWS

Semester 1 Reports together with your child's Assessment Portfolio will be sent home on Friday 24th June 2022. We anticipate that Parent/Teacher interviews will be held early in Term 3. They will hopefully take place on Wednesday 13th July 2022 (depending on the government advice/regulations at that time). The **students will finish school at 12pm on this day**. There will be more information provided in the coming weeks.

Holy Eucharist School is seeking a proposal from suitably qualified applicants to provide an onsite canteen service to its students and staff from the premises at 1A Oleander Drive St Albans, which the applicant will lease for an approved rent.

The canteen proposal must:

- Be based on a 12-month agreement (Commencement in Term 3, 2022)

- Provide for approximately 600 people (530 students and 70 staff)

 Provision to service Vietnamese school on Saturdays (3 breaks between 1.00pm 3.15pm)
- Nominate the Hire/Rental Fee (inclusive of the cost of services required to operate the Canteen)
- The number of Staff rostered/required to service the canteen on a daily basis
- The menu options available for purchase (Must include: a number of healthy options, food allergy and intolerant options, vegetarian options)
- Public liability Insurance information
- Include processes for monitoring Vaccination and Working With Children Check requirements.

CATHOLIC EDUCATION ELECTION REPORT CARD ON MAJOR PARTIES

Catholic education has released a federal election report card assessing the responses from the major political parties on education priorities.

The report card assess the Coalition, Labor and Green's responses to the priorities of:

- · Genuine school choice through fair funding and ensuring affordable contributions from families
- Enabling faith-based education through religious protections
- Improving capital funding
- Support for delivering national priorities such as quality teaching, early childhood education, mental health and wellbeing
 programs and Closing the gap initiatives for Aboriginal and Torres Islander students

National Catholic Education executive director Jacinta Collins said the report card shows the Liberal National Coalition and Labor are on par in addressing Catholic education's priorities, particularly on school choice.

"We are fortunate that both major parties continue to support genuine school choice in Australian education and are committed to families who choose a Catholic education for their children," Ms Collins said.

Responses sought from key independent candidates are also being evaluated.

AUSTRALIAN DENTAL HEALTH - VICTORIA

Australian Dental Health Victoria will be visiting Holy Eucharist School in September. To prepare for this visit forms need to be signed by parents. Dental forms will go to every individual child next week. **Australian Dental Health Victoria** will see every child regardless of eligibility and will continue to work beyond the **CDBS** (Child Dental Benefits Schedule) to ensure every **Victorian** child is receiving a fair go.

(Previous dental providers only see eligible kids, children who don't qualify for the grant will miss out. The **ADHV** will provide an opportunity for all children to be seen)

Australian Dental Health Victoria Procedure:

- Each child will receive a consent form, which the ADHV will provide to the school by an allocated school representative
- Students that return their consent form will be seen, if not eligible from **Medicare** students will be seen for Free by **Australian Dental Health Victoria**
- Australian Dental Health Victoria runs logistics, parental consent, oral health classes and manages all paperwork and class listings
- All refugee families are welcomed and always will be welcome regardless of Health care or Medicare card.

ENGLISH AS AN ADDITIONAL LANGUAGE (EAL)

Last year the Department of Education with the Victorian Curriculum and Assessment Authority released a revised version of the English as an Additional Language Curriculum. This curriculum is not inferior to the English Victorian Curriculum. It has been devised in order to provide students that speak a language other than English the best opportunity to develop their English in what is called modes - Speaking and Listening, Reading and Viewing and Writing. The revised version is now being implemented in all Department, Catholic and Independent schools.

As a result, teachers at Holy Eucharist have examined the information collected from you during parent teacher interviews at the beginning of the year, to decide which curriculum would best suit students' needs. Therefore, a number of students will now be following an EAL pathway and they will receive an EAL report to assess their Literacy skills. Teachers will advise you if this is the case. Please do not be alarmed. I reiterate, this curriculum is not inferior! Literacy is still taught in the same way but with more of an emphasis on developing proficiency/skills/knowledge, such as understanding grammar, learning new vocabulary, speaking correctly in full sentences etc.
