A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke (Lk 9:28-36)

We utilised this time in preparation for our School Review by looking at the Vision and Mission of Holy Eucharist School and to familiarise ourselves with the 11 New Child Safe Standards which came into effect on 1st July 2022

Last week, I posted a note on Class Dojo regarding facemasks. The Department of Education, together with the Independent Schools and Catholic Education Commission of Victoria are strongly recommending that students who are 8 years and above wear a facemask in indoor settings. Your support will help keep our school open and will ensure that our students and staff remain safe and healthy. We will have facemasks and handsanitiser available at all gates and in all classrooms.

On a more positive note, I would like to congratulate all our Grade Prep students who celebrated 100 days at school. The Prep students celebrated the day by participating in 4 different FUNFIT workshops and they had a sausage sizzle. I would also like to congratulate Ms Allison Borg who will be getting married tomorrow. On behalf of everyone at Holy Eucharist I would like to wish Allison and her partner Joe all the very best.

Today, we also bid farewell to our Administration Officer, Mrs Connie LaMacchia. Connie has been part of our Holy Eucharist family for almost 13 years. Connie has taken on a new administrative position at CRC St Albans. We will miss Connie and thank her for her hard work and commitment to Holy Eucharist and wish her all the best. Ms Stefani Richardson has been appointed to take on the administrative position and we welcome her to our school.

Finally, I would like to thank all the parents and carers who participated in Parent Support Group (PSG) discussions over the last few weeks. At Holy Eucharist we recognise the importance of working in collaboration with our families. For students with diverse needs, these partnerships between family and school are crucial in supporting our students. As parents/carers, "you have a depth of knowledge and can make valuable contributions about additional practices and processes that will support your child at school" (CECV, 2021). During the PSGs it was pleasing to see our parents/carers and staff working together in partnership to support our students with diverse needs. Our National Consistent Collection of Data (NCCD) for funding of children with additional needs will be submitted on 5th August 2022.

COVID-19 UPDATES

Face Masks:

Last week, a letter was posted on Class Dojo regarding the wearing of face masks at school.

The Victorian Department of Health strongly recommends that face masks are worn in indoor settings.

As a result, the Catholic Education Commission of Victoria (CECV) together with the Department of Education and Training (DET) and Independent Schools Victoria have asked that all students aged 8 and over and all staff in all schools across Victoria to wear masks when in class (except where removing a mask is necessary for clear communication) from now to the end of winter.

They have stipulated that students won't be required or expected to wear masks when outdoors, and this expectation won't stop student participation in the full range of school activities, including music, sport and performances.

Catholic Education Commission of Victoria (CECV) together with the Department of Education and Training (DET) and Independent Schools Victoria have asked for your support in explaining to your child or children the importance of this simple step that will help keep our schools as safe as possible.

They have also urged that you make sure your child (or children) takes a mask to school (and wears it if they are travelling on public transport) or collects a mask when they arrive at school.

We all appreciate how important it is for students to be back at school. This action will help make sure as many students and staff as possible are protected from COVID and other winter illness. Thank for your help with this collective effort to keep our communities safe and healthy.

Rapid Antigen Tests (RATs):

The Victorian Government is providing up to three further deliveries of Rapid Antigen Tests (RATs) in Term 3 and again in Term 4 to schools. These will be available for collection from the school office for those who are symptomatic or who are household contacts.

Transport of children to school by positive cases:

Parents/carers who are COVID-19 positive can now leave self-isolation to transport children to or from school via private vehicle. However, the parent/carer must travel directly to and from the school only. They must remain in the vehicle at all times, unless it is reasonably necessary to leave the vehicle to walk the child to and from the entrance of the school safely. They must wear a face mask at all times.

Expanded eligibility for fourth COVID-19 vaccine dose:

The Australian Technical Advisory Group on Immunisation (ATAGI) has updated its recommendations around fourth doses of COVID-19 vaccination. From Monday 11 July 2022, people over 30 years will be eligible for a fourth dose. ATAGI recommends that people aged 50 to 64 years should have their fourth dose, while those aged 30 to 49 years may choose to have a fourth dose. For further information see the ATAGI website.

IS YOUR CHILD UNWELL? IF YES...PLEASE KEEP THEM AT HOME!

Staff members and students must stay at home if they are unwell or if they have COVID-19.

Please remember, that your child should **not come to school** if they have a sore throat, a temperature, if they feel fatigued (tiredness), if they have a loss of taste or smell, tummy pains or shortness of breath. If the students show any of these symptoms whilst at school, they will be sent home immediately. The constant message is for all of us to be responsible in the actions we take. By keeping yourself safe, you are keeping your families, your colleagues and your friends safe.

PARKING

There are still a number of parents/carers who are leaving their cars parked unattended along the church driveway. PLEASE DO NOT LEAVE YOUR CAR PARKED IN THE DRIVEWAY NEXT TO THE CHURCH TO PICK UP YOUR CHILD/REN! When this happens, the people behind you become angry and frustrated because they are blocked and cannot leave.

The church driveway should work just like a Kiss & Go Zone. This means that:

- The Kiss and Go Zone is a "No Parking" area.
- The driver should remain in their vehicles at all times.
- When you leave home you need to ensure that your child is in their seats with their bags with them.
- Your child must use the footpath side of the door when getting in and out of the car.
- The driver must never double park.
- If the Kiss & Go Zone is full or you wish to get out of the car, please park in an area away from the Kiss & Go Zone.
- When crossing the driveway, please use the Zebra Crossing. We need to set good examples for our children.
- Do not park in the Staff Car Park to Drop Off or Pick Up Children.

Please make sure that you obey the parking restrictions around the school, as there have been many complaints from parents/carers who have received parking fines. Please note that Brimbank Council are issuing these fines to people not obeying the law and not the school. Therefore, the school cannot cancel or pay for these fines.

Please ensure that you adhere to the following road rules:

- Do not leave your car unattended in the church driveway
- Do not block or park in neighbouring driveways
- **Do not** double park. Even if it is for a few seconds.
- Only those persons with **DISABLED** stickers are permitted to park in the disabled parking bays at front of school.
- Do not park on people's nature strips.

The parking situation around the school is not ideal. However, I have been liaising with Brimbank Council to come up with ways to improve the parking situation around the school.

SCHOOL REVIEW

In Victoria, schools are reviewed to make sure they are meeting the minimum standards and other requirements for registration. The review is a requirement by the Victorian Registration and Qualifications Authority (VRQA). Catholic schools in the Archdiocese of Melbourne take part in the review process every 4 years. The School Review is used to support deep learning and ongoing monitoring of improvement throughout the four-year continuous improvement process within the School Improvement Framework.

School Review supports schools and the wider system to foster improvement in an ongoing and continuous way, as well as ensuring schools continue to meet external legislative and regulatory requirements.

School Review has two main dimensions – Improvement and Compliance.

In Term 3, we have another School Closure Day to prepare staff for our School Review. Therefore, the school will be closed on Friday 19th August 2022




SCHOOL/MACS POLICIES - UPDATED

ENROLMENTS 2023


Enrolments are now open for 2023.


