

**Principal's Message:**

Dear Holy Eucharist Community,

The month of November is traditionally a time when we remember both the Saints, and those who have died. Saints lived at different times in different places throughout history, but they all shared a love of God. They lived lives in holiness, dedicated to serving God and spreading His message of salvation. As Catholics, we believe that saints "intercede" for us here on earth, and in a special way, they are linked with us in what we call "The communion of Saints."

The Feast of All Souls is a source of consolation and hope for each of us. ### ASSESSMENT AND REPORTING – SEMESTER 2

On Friday 9<sup>th</sup> December 2022 parents/carers will receive their child's formal report as well as their child's Assessment Portfolio. The work samples inside the portfolio are collected by the teacher as evidence of what has been taught during the term. These samples support what has been documented in the topic outline and should be looked at in conjunction with your child's report.

Assessment Portfolios will need to be signed and returned to school by Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> December. The classroom teacher will pass these folders onto next year's teacher. All work samples collected during the year will be placed inside a Holy Eucharist Assessment envelope and given to you to keep.

### PARKING AROUND THE SCHOOL PREMISES

**Brimbank Council are issuing fines to people who were not obeying the law. The school is not authorised to cancel your parking infringements and will not pay for these!!!**

Please ensure that you adhere to the following road rules:

- **Do not** leave your car unattended in the church driveway
- **Do not** block or park in neighbouring driveways
- **Do not** double park. Even if it is for a few seconds.
- Only those persons with **DISABLED** stickers are permitted to park in the disabled parking bays at the front of the school.
- **Do not** park on people's nature strips.



## GATES

The construction of our new building has started. Construction site offices have been placed in the staff car park, which means that the staff can no longer park their cars in the staff carpark. The staff are now required to park on the rounders court. Temporary fencing has been installed on the rounders court to keep students safe and away from cars.

For the time being, the pedestrian gate next to the hall (i.e. **GATE 1, Gr Prep and Gr 3**) **will be permanently closed**. Grade Prep will now need to enter/leave via the Church gate (GATE 2) and Grade 3 will need to enter/leave via the Administration gate (GATE 3).

Please remember:

- Gates will open for students at 8:30am
- Classrooms will open at 8:45am
- All students will start school at 8:55am
- Grade Prep, Grade 1 and Grade 2 will finish school at 3:10pm.
- Grade 3, Grade 4, Grade 5 and Grade 6 will finish at 3:15pm

NB: If there is more than one child in the family, parents/carers can use one gate to drop off and pick up their children (as long as one child from the family is from the year level specified on the gate. The same gate must be used for pick-up).



## COVID-19 UPDATES

The Victorian Government has announced the end of the pandemic declaration and associated pandemic orders. New settings will apply from 11.59 pm on Wednesday 12 October 2022.

Requirements for close contacts, like continually testing negative on a rapid antigen test (RAT), will become strong recommendations – joining the strong recommendation to wear a mask indoors, which will remain in place.

### Changes to COVID-19 isolation requirements

It is strongly recommended that **students**:

- who test positive for COVID-19 should stay home and isolate for five days
- should not attend school after five days if still symptomatic
- who are symptomatic but have not tested positive should not attend school.

Where **students** become symptomatic at school, they should:

- be collected by their parents/carers
- undergo testing for COVID-19.

It is strongly recommended that **staff**:

- who test positive for COVID-19 should stay home and isolate for five days
- should not attend school after five days if still symptomatic
- who are symptomatic but have not tested positive should not attend school.

### COVID-19 reporting requirements

The Department of Health recommends that a person who tests positive for COVID-19 should inform those with whom they have recently been in contact, including their workplace, school and household.

Schools are therefore asked to continue reporting positive COVID-19 cases to Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools (MACS). Schools no longer have to alert the community of any positive cases.

### Face masks

Staff and students who wish to wear a face mask should be supported to do so, and schools should continue to make face masks available for staff, students and visitors.

The Department of Health recommends that masks should be worn by a person who is a close contact of someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 when leaving home.

Additionally, the department recommends that masks should be worn by a person who has COVID-19 for 10 days after a positive test when they need to leave home.

### COVIDSafe Plans

Schools must keep their COVIDSafe Plan in place, which should be regularly reviewed and updated as required.

## LITERACY

### Literacy News

As you aware we held a Book Fair during August. Thanks to the support of our families, we raised almost \$1300. Jenny Bistricki, our librarian, has been busily ordering books from Scholastic for the library. As you can see in the picture, we have been able to order a large range of books, including favourites, graphic novels, and short chapter books to cater for the Prep, Year 1, and Year 2 students. Students please be patient as Mrs Bistricki and Mrs Rita have a big job to get these books ready for borrowing. We will keep you posted ☺



### Library books

And this brings me to reminding all the students that it is a privilege to borrow any books or in fact use any materials from Holy Eucharist. With the privilege comes responsibility. Students please take care of the books that you borrow so that other children will enjoy reading when you return borrowed items. Parents, please remind your child/children to borrow books during their class borrowing time. All students should be borrowing to read for enjoyment

at home. If your child is having difficulty finding lost books encourage them to look everywhere at home, in the car or at grandparent's homes. Please let us know if you are having difficulty locating.

### Take Home Readers

We provide take home readers so that students are reading texts at their level. Again, the same responsibly applies with these readers. In this instance it is even more important that students are borrowing books and reading each night as part of their homework. It is even more important for students in Prep, Year 1, and Year 2 as they are learning to read. They should be practising to read at home. Your child can read the book out aloud to anyone in the family. And it doesn't matter if English is not your first language. Just allow your child to read while you listen. Again, if your child is having difficulty finding misplaced readers, please let us know as I can arrange alternatives for them to keep reading.

As you know we have reading platforms that can be used online. Whilst this is not my preference I would rather that students are reading even if it is from a screen.

The following 3 platforms offer levelled readers:

#### *Sunshine Online*

Year 1, Year 2 and a small number of Year 3, 4 and 5 students have an account with PMe Cengage. This is another option.

### Writing

Writing sessions usually occur four times per week in each class throughout the week.

Earlier this year, teachers identified that students need to work on improving sentence structure. They have provided the students with many and varied ways to build their ability to write grammatically correct sentences. This does not happen overnight. It has involved explicitly teaching the purpose, structure and features of different text types, exploring sentences in rich literature, analysing sentence and word types and rewriting sentences to include learned skills.

In addition to teaching genre some year levels have introduced *Writer's Notebook* allowing the students to bring in a 'seed' that the students would like to write about. Others have introduced 'rocket/snapshot/fast' write, all the same really, to give the students opportunities to write for their own enjoyment. Some teachers have provided students with a prompt to write, for example, a picture from *Pobble* or *Secret Door* to prompt ideas.

Please encourage your child/children to write. Having a scrapbook to record ideas, thoughts, paste pictures or even draw can help develop children's writing skills. Students need to have a purpose, and this could be their steppingstone into the world of writing. Writing is fun.

In the next newsletter I will include information on the writing process that supports students to write.


