Holy Eucharist School will be hosting our annual Parent/Teacher Chats on Wednesday 8th March 2023 from 12:10pm until 6:00pm. Please note that students will be finishing school at 12pm. Parent/Teacher Chats are a great opportunity to communicate with your child's teacher and to hear about how your child has settled into their new class. However, they are also a great way to discuss any concerns or questions you may have regarding your child. It is important that you take

the time to think about the things you would like to discuss with your child's teacher, to ensure you make the most of your allocated time

The Parent /Teacher Chats will be approximately **10 minutes in length** – just enough time for you and your child's teacher to meet and/or communicate. During this meeting, your child's teacher will be asking questions which will provide them with important information. SCHOOL HATS IN TERM 1

There are still quite a number of students at our school who do not have a school hat. In Australia we have "one of the highest rates of melanoma diagnoses in the world...two in three Australians will be diagnosed with skin cancer by the age of 70" (SunSmart, 2019). The good news is that almost all skin cancers are preventable. It is recommended that staff and students use a combination of sun protection measures (i.e. sun hat, sunscreen, clothing, shade and sunglasses when outdoors, avoid deliberate and extended sun exposure) when UV index levels are 3 or above (generally from mid-August to the end of April in Victoria). In Term 1 and Term 4 all students and teachers are required to wear a hat when they are outside. It is an expectation and school policy that all students wear their school hat and the

NAPLAN 2023

The National Assessment Program - Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) for Year 3 and Year 5 will commence on Wednesday 15th March until Friday 17th March 2023. Students who are absent from 15th - 17th March will have the opportunity to complete the catch-up tests (for most subject areas) the following week.



Literacy and Numeracy

NAPLAN is a nationwide measure through which parents, teachers, schools, education authorities, governments and the broader community can determine whether or not young Australians are developing the literacy and numeracy skills that provide the critical foundation for other learning and for their productive and rewarding participation in the community.

NAPLAN results allow parents/carers and educators to see how students are progressing in literacy and numeracy over time individually, as part of their school community, and against national standards. The assessments are undertaken nationwide, every year, in the second full week in May.

NAPLAN is made up of tests in the four areas (or 'domains') of:


- Reading
- Writing
- Language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation)
- Numeracy

NAPLAN (Cont'd)

Last week the Australian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA) published the 2022 NAPLAN testing Data on the 'My School' website. NAPLAN (the National Assessment Program - Literacy and Numeracy) is the only national assessment that all Australian students are required to undertake. This assessment provides comparable data about student performance in literacy and numeracy nationally and over time.

The table below shows the average student results at Holy Eucharist School for the selected year. The cell colour shows how the school's results compare to those of students with a similar background.



NAPLAN participation for all Australian students is 95%


The table below shows the percentage of students at Holy Eucharist School who achieved above average progress, compared to students of a similar background and who had the same starting score on their previous NAPLAN test.



^{NB} In 2020 education ministers decided that NAPLAN testing would not proceed that year due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Therefore, there is no 2018-2020 and 2020-2022 student progress available.

Due to the cancellation of NAPLAN in 2020, we are unable to show student growth from 2020 to 2022 for each of the domains. However we are able to show the average NAPLAN score for all students at the school in each domain over time, compared to the average score of students with a similar background.

The colour of the diamonds show how the school's results compared to those of students with a similar background. The whiskers around the diamond show the margin of error at 90 per cent level of confidence.

UPDATE TO COVID-19 SETTINGS FOR TERM 1, 2023

COVIDSafe measures have changed, however schools are required to continue to implement important practices to reduce the risk of COVID-19 transmission. Schools must keep their COVIDSafe Plan in place and will need to review and update these as required.

Schools must continue to ensure air purifiers are used, external ventilation is maximised, good personal hygiene is encouraged, and face masks are made available for staff, students and visitors who wish to wear them.

It is recommended that rapid antigen tests (RATs) are used by students and staff if they:

- have symptoms of COVID-19 infection, no matter how mild _ are a household or close contact of someone who has COVID-19
- are a social contact of someone who has COVID-19.

The Department of Health recommends that all Victorians report their positive RAT result via the online form or by calling 1800 675 398. Principals are no longer required to inform their school community of a positive case associated with the school, and also, schools are no longer required to report COVID-19 case numbers to Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools (MACS). RATs are available for all Victorians from council sites. Individuals can obtain two free packs (10 tests) for themselves and two free packs (10 tests) for each of their household members. People with disability and their carers can get up to four free packs (20 tests) in line with existing RAT distribution for people with disability.

NEW BUILDING

Last Thursday, the slab was poured on the first floor of our new building. The concrete will need to dry properly before the supporting frame on the ground floor can be removed. It will take the slab approximately 28 days to dry properly. In the next fortnight there will be more concrete used to create the supporting columns on level 1. When the concrete columns have dried the construction of the metal frame and roof will proceed. Next week, we should have our bricks delivered.
