A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

You are to conceive and bear a son. (Lk 1:26-38)

*The angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph, of the House of David; and the virgin's name was Mary. He went in and said to her, 'Rejoice, so highly favoured! The Lord is with you.' She was deeply disturbed by these words and asked herself what this greeting could mean, but the angel said to her, 'Mary, do not be afraid; you have won God's favour. Listen! You are to conceive and bear a son, and you must name him Jesus. He will be great and will be called Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his ancestor David; he will rule over the House of Jacob for ever and his reign will have no end.' ARRIVAL AT SCHOOL EACH DAY...

We have a number of students who are coming to school **either very early, or very late** in the morning. **The students should not be left outside the gates before 8:30am as they are unsupervised.** If you need to drop off your child at school early because of work commitments, then students will need to go to **Before School Care**. Camp Australia is contracted by the school to provide this service from 7am each day until 8:30am. **After School Care** is also available from 3:10am until 6pm. Parents/Carers will need to enrol their child prior to their child attending the service, which will incur a fee. Teachers begin supervision on the school grounds at 8:30am when the gates open.

If your child arrives at school after 9am, they will need to enter via the Administration Gate, as all other gates will be locked. If your child arrives at school after 9:15am, they will need to obtain a late pass from the school office. Each time a student is issued with a late pass, it is recorded on the roll, which then appears on the student's report card each semester.

Please remember that the whole school has a literacy block in the morning where students participate in intensive reading and writing activities. Students who are arriving late are missing out on specific instructions for given tasks. As a result, teachers are finding that they have to go through instructions again, which in turn, is taking them away from teaching the rest of the class.

During our Parent/Teacher Chats, we were informed by parents/carers that many of our students are going to bed very late at night. As a result, they struggle to get out of bed in the morning and come to school feeling tired. Please remember, if your child is tired then they are going to find it difficult to learn!



GRADE 5 CAMP

The Grade 5s will be attending **Gundiwindi Camp** on **Monday 20th March until Wednesday 22nd March 2023**. The campsite is less than 50kms from Melbourne and is situated on the border of Wandin North and Silvan, Victoria. NAPLAN 2023

This week, students in Year 3 and Year 5 took part in The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN). Students who were absent from 15th - 17th March will have the opportunity to complete the catch-up tests (for most subject areas) next week.



NAPLAN is a nationwide measure through which parents, teachers, schools, education authorities, governments and the broader community can determine whether or not young Australians are developing the literacy and numeracy skills that provide the critical foundation for other learning and for their productive and rewarding participation in the community.

NAPLAN results allow parents/carers and educators to see how students are progressing in literacy and numeracy over time – individually, as part of their school community, and against national standards. The assessments are undertaken nationwide, every year, in the second full week in May.

NAPLAN is made up of tests in the four areas (or 'domains') of:

- Reading
- Writing
- Language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation)
- Numeracy.

UPDATE TO COVID-19 SETTINGS FOR TERM 1, 2023

COVIDSafe measures have changed, however schools are required to continue to implement important practices to reduce the risk of COVID-19 transmission. Schools must keep their COVIDSafe Plan in place and will need to review and update these as required.

Schools must continue to ensure air purifiers are used, external ventilation is maximised, good personal hygiene is encouraged, and face masks are made available for staff, students and visitors who wish to wear them.

It is recommended that rapid antigen tests (RATs) are used by students and staff if they:

- have symptoms of COVID-19 infection, no matter how mild
- are a household or close contact of someone who has COVID-19
- are a social contact of someone who has COVID-19.

The Department of Health recommends that all Victorians report their positive RAT result via the online form or by calling 1800 675 398. Principals are no longer required to inform their school community of a positive case associated with the school, and also, schools are no longer required to report COVID-19 case numbers to Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools (MACS).

RATs are available for all Victorians from council sites. Individuals can obtain two free packs (10 tests) for themselves and two free packs (10 tests) for each of their household members. People with disability and their carers can get up to four free packs (20 tests) in line with existing RAT distribution for people with disability.

RECYCLING BINS

A few weeks ago, I contacted Brimbank City Council in regards to recycling. They have provided our school with 10 large wheelie bins to be used strictly for recycling. The council will be collecting the bins every 2nd Monday morning. We have also purchased 34 small grey bins, 1 for each classroom, to be used for recycling. These bins will need be emptied each day into the big yellow wheelie bins by the classroom monitors. The 10 large wheelie bins have been strategically placed around the school so that they can be accessed by the classroom monitors. This week the students have learnt about what can be placed in the recycle bins.

The following items can be placed in the bins:

- ✓ Paper and cardboard (flattened boxes)
- ✓ Hard plastic bottles without lids (must be empty and dry)
- ✓ Hard plastic containers (must be empty and dry)

The following items cannot be placed in the bins:

- ✗ No plastic wraps/packets
- ✗ No polystyrene
- ✗ No food scraps
- ✗ No juice boxes or milk cartons



NEW BUILDING

The architect has provided me with an image of the brickwork cross which will feature on our new building. The cross be on the side of the lift shaft.

During the site meeting this week, I was informed that the slab on the first floor is almost completely dry. The builders need to leave it to dry for at least 28 days so that the temporary weight bearing frame on the ground floor can be removed. The builders are now preparing the steel for the supporting columns on level 1. Timber frames have been placed around the steel to create a mould for the concrete. Concrete will then be poured into the timber moulds to create the new columns. When the concrete columns have dried the construction of the metal frame and roof will proceed. The bricks were delivered last week.

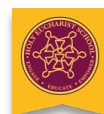

LITERACY NEWS

What's been happening?

Students have been very busy reading and writing a variety of texts and for many and varied purposes. Teachers have also been very busy planning, preparing learning tasks and assessing students. It has been my pleasure to observe what the students have been learning, how they have applied skills as well as to see their responses to texts both in reading and writing.

Year 5 Author Incursion

During my time as the Literacy Leader, Sofie Laguna has visited Holy Eucharist twice. And, I have had the pleasure of listening to her speak to the students on both occasions. Sofie was born in 1968 in Sydney. She studied to be a lawyer, but after deciding law was not for her, she trained as an actor. Sofie is now an author, actor, and playwright. She has written several books for both children and adults.

The Year 5 students have been reading 'Meet Grace', a story based in 1808, this term, to support them with understanding Australia's history as well as to work on reading strategies that support comprehension. 'Meet Grace' is the first in a series of 4 exciting stories. Without giving too much away about the plot, Grace is a convict girl who was given a second chance.

During her talk, Sophie explained to the students and teachers her journey and the process of writing she undertakes as a writer and author and encouraged the students to use a journal to record their thoughts, feelings, and ideas as it is from these thoughts that stories generate.

Sophie brought along several copies of her newly re-released book, a compilation 'The Grace Stories: 4 books in one' for the Year 5 students to purchase and kindly signed these. Sophie also signed and donated a copy of her newest book, 'The Glow' to our library. This will be added to our collection for all students to access, once I have finished reading it first :-)



Take Home Readers

All students are expected to be reading as part of their home learning routine. This is an important task as it supports the development not only of reading skills and strategies but also the enjoyment of reading. It doesn't matter if the book is fact or fiction as the text type is not the key focus. By having access to a huge range of books and more importantly levelled texts students can continue to practise reading at their level. And we do offer a large range of texts so surely there should be something that each student will enjoy reading!

Students have a maroon reader satchel/pocket. This should be brought to school every day, although they may not need to change their book if it is not finished or if it is the expectation of the class teacher that the student reads the book over a few days.

Parents/caregivers please ask your child/children to get the book out and read it each afternoon or evening, Monday to Thursday. It is enough for you just to listen if English is not your first language. If your child has an older brother or sister, perhaps a cousin or friend that could listen to them read that is okay too. Please sign the recording sheet or diary to show that your child has read.

If your child does not bring their Reader Satchel/Pocket to school on a regular basis we will need to follow this up. Please do not hesitate to contact your child's teacher or myself if you need any support with this. I am more than happy to meet with you to model how and what or even to provide suggestions as to how to set up a routine to ensure that your child is reading as part of homework. I understand that there may be circumstances where this cannot happen due to appointments or celebrations etc and of course this is fine. If there are other circumstances that may prevent regular reading or homework to be completed, please let us know as we will work with to support you and your child with solutions.

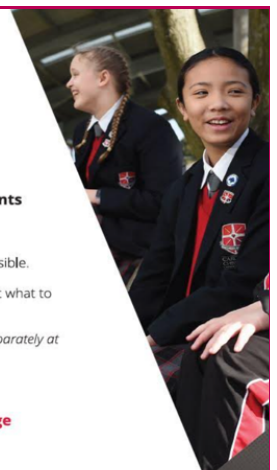

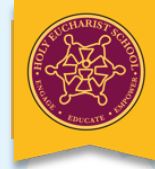
