Easter Sunday is on the 9<sup>th</sup> April this year, immediately after we finish Term One. For those who have been newly initiated, it is a time to reflect on their experiences and is oriented towards spiritual growth and entering more fully into the life of the community. Dear Holy Eucharist Community,

We have almost come to the end of Term 1 and the school holidays are around the corner! It has been an extremely busy term, where students have been engaged in class activities and lots of learning has taken place. However, over the past few weeks, I have noticed that a number of students are arriving at school very late in the morning. Please remember that the whole school has a Literacy block in the morning where students participate in intensive reading and writing activities. When students arrive late, they are missing out on instructions and as a result, teachers have to go through instructions again, which in turn, is taking them away from teaching the rest of the class. The staff have also come to realise that many of our students are going to bed very late at night. As a result, they struggle to get out of bed in the morning and come to school feeling tired. If your child is tired in the morning, they may find it difficult to learn!

On the 17th of March, we celebrated Catholic Education Week. As part of this celebration, our Vice Captains Mya and Vibeshan, our School Captains Cecilia and Harkeerat, together with Ms Cablao and Mrs Xuereb went to St Patrick's Cathedral to take part in the annual St Patrick's Day Mass. The theme for Catholic Education Week 2023 is 'Forming lives of faith, hope and love in the light of Christ'. There were many student representatives from Catholic schools in the Melbourne archdiocese who took part in this celebration.

Last Sunday, 26<sup>th</sup> March, Holy Eucharist Parish celebrated its annual Multicultural Day with Mass followed by a sausage sizzle. Vy from Grade 6 JC represented our school during the liturgy and read during the Prayers of the Faithful. It was lovely to see so many of you at the celebration.

Next week is Holy Week. On Thursday the whole school will be taking part in the Stations of the Cross. Thank you to Ms Morrell for preparing the Grade 6 students. The Stations of the Cross, also known as the Way of the Cross, enables us to recall and meditate on the events of Jesus' death and resurrection. At 12:30pm, we will be having our end of term assembly as well as our Easter Bonnet Parade on the oval. Parent and Carers are welcome to attend. We will be giving out prizes to students in each year level. Please remember that Thursday is also Casual Day (gold coin donation) and that the students will be finishing school early (that is, 1:55pm for students in Prep to Grade 2 and at 2 pm for students in Grades 3 to Grade 6).

Please remember that the students will return to school for Term 2 on Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup> April 2023. **The school will be closed on Monday 24<sup>th</sup> April 2023**, as the staff will be participating in Professional Learning on Autism. **The school will also be closed on Tuesday 25<sup>th</sup> April 2023**, as it is a public holiday for ANZAC Day.

I hope you all have a very happy Easter and a safe and restful break. I look forward to seeing you all in Term 2, which will commence on Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup> April 2023.

## ARRIVAL AT SCHOOL EACH DAY...

We have a number of students who are coming to school **either very early, or very late** in the morning. <u>The students should</u> <u>not be left outside the gates before 8:30am as they are unsupervised</u>. If you need to drop off your child at school early because of work commitments, then students will need to go to <u>Before School Care</u>. Camp Australia is contracted by the school to provide this service from 7am each day until 8:30am. <u>After School Care</u> is also available from 3:10am until 6pm. Parents/Carers will need to enrol their child prior to their child attending the service, which will incur a fee. Teachers begin supervision on the school grounds at 8:30am when the gates open.

If your child arrives at school after 9am, they will need to enter via the Administration Gate, as all other gates will be locked. If your child arrives at school after 9:15am, they will need to obtain a late pass from the school office. Each time a student is issued with a late pass, it is recorded on the roll, which then appears on the student's report card each semester.

Please remember that the whole school has a literacy block in the morning where students participate in intensive reading and writing activities. Students who are arriving late are missing out on specific instructions for given tasks. As a result, teachers are finding that they have to go through instructions again, which in turn, is taking them away from teaching the rest of the class.

## BEDTIME!

During our Parent/Teacher Chats, we were informed by parents/carers that many of our students are going to bed very late at night. As a result, they struggle to get out of bed in the morning and come to school feeling tired. Please remember, if your child is tired then they are going to find it difficult to learn!

IS YOUR CHILD UNWELL? IF YES ... PLEASE KEEP THEM AT HOME!

Students must stay at home if they are unwell or if they may have been exposed to COVID-19. This can prevent an entire class or the rest of the school having to quarantine.

**Please remember**, when your child returns to onsite learning, it is vital that **they do not come to school** if they have any of the following symptoms:

- sore throat
- temperature
- tiredness
- loss of taste or smell
- tummy pains
- shortness of breath.

If the students show any of the above symptoms they will be sent home immediately.

It is important that your emergency contact details are up to date. It is also essential that your emergency contact person is available if, for any reason you are unable to pick up your child if we ring you.

The constant message is for all of us to be responsible in the actions we take. By keeping yourself safe, you are keeping your families, your colleagues and your friends safe.

### **UPDATE TO COVID-19 SETTINGS FOR TERM 1, 2023**

COVIDSafe measures have changed, however schools are required to continue to implement important practices to reduce the risk of COVID-19 transmission. Schools must keep their COVIDSafe Plan in place and will need to review and update these as required.

Schools must continue to ensure air purifiers are used, external ventilation is maximised, good personal hygiene is encouraged, and face masks are made available for staff, students and visitors who wish to wear them.

- It is recommended that rapid antigen tests (RATs) are used by students and staff if they:
  - have symptoms of COVID-19 infection, no matter how mild
    - are a household or close contact of someone who has COVID-19
    - are a social contact of someone who has COVID-19.

tests) in line with existing RAT distribution for people with disability.

The Department of Health recommends that all Victorians report their positive RAT result via the online form or by calling 1800 675 398. Principals are no longer required to inform their school community of a positive case associated with the school, and also, schools are no longer required to report COVID-19 case numbers to Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools (MACS). RATs are available for all Victorians from council sites. Individuals can obtain two free packs (10 tests) for themselves and two free packs (10 tests) for each of their household members. People with disability and their carers can get up to four free packs (20

## **NEW BUILDING**

On Tuesday I met with the architect and builder for our fortnightly site meeting. I am pleased to report that the pouring of the concrete for the columns on the first floor are now complete. The builders will now begin removing the supporting frames on the ground floor so that the carpenters can begin next week. They will begin building the timber mould for the spiral staircase so that the concrete can be poured.

Over the holidays the scaffolding will be placed around the perimeter of the building so that the metal frame for the roof can be installed. The concrete outside the toilets and the asphalt over the trenches should be completed by the time we get back from the Easter break.

### Fees for 2023


