Dear Holy Eucharist Community,

On behalf of our school and parish community, I would like to congratulate our Year 6 students and the students from the Preca Centre, for receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation last Friday. I would also like to thank Mrs Vanessa Shaw and Br Noel Debono for all their hard work in making sure that the 52 candidates were prepared for their final Sacrament of Initiation. I am also very grateful to our staff, particularly the Year 6 teachers, who prepared the students for this Sacrament and to all the teachers who attended the ceremony and to those who were sponsors. Thank you also to Bishop Martin Ashe, Father Vincent and to Father Joseph for their support and guidance. The celebration was prayerful and reverent.

Last Tuesday evening, we had our Family Faith Evening in the hall for the students who are about to receive their Holy Communion for the first time. I would like to thank the parents/carers and staff who attended the evening. We were again, very fortunate to have Ms Eloise Meyer (RE Learning Consultant at MACS) as our guest speaker. The Year 4 students will be receiving the Sacrament of First Holy Communion on Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> June at the 10am Mass (*which is also the Feast of Corpus Christi, the Body and Blood of Christ*). Please remember these students in your prayers.

This week is National Reconciliation Week (NRW). It is a time for all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures, and achievements, and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia. Each year, we celebrate NRW from 27 May to 3 June. These dates commemorate two significant events in our journey towards reconciliation:

- On 27<sup>th</sup> May 1967, Australians voted to change the Constitution so that Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples would be included as part of the population and so that the Commonwealth would be able to make laws for them.
- On 3<sup>rd</sup> June 1992, the High Court of Australia court overturned the concept of 'terra nullius' (*meaning that no one owned the lands before European Settlement*), leading to the legal recognition of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples as the Traditional Owners and Custodians of lands. This paved the way for the recognition and protection of native title across Australia, and the passing of the *Native Title Act 1993* (Cth).

"Reconciliation must live in the hearts, minds and actions of all Australians as we move forward, creating a nation strengthened by respectful relationships between the wider Australian community, and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples" (RA, 2021).

### CHILDREN ARRIVING TO SCHOOL TOO EARLY IN THE MORNING:

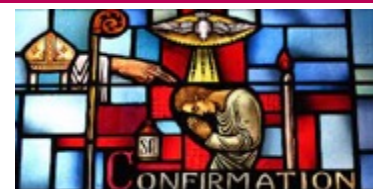
We regard Parent - Teacher Interviews and Assessment and Reporting as a vital part of our school program. On Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> June 2023, you will receive your child's formal report and Assessment Portfolio. The work samples inside the portfolio were collected in Term 1 and Term 2 as evidence of what has been taught during Semester 1. These samples support what has been documented in the term outlines and should be looked at in conjunction with your child's report, prior to the Parent - Teacher Interviews.

Parent - Teacher Interviews are a great opportunity to communicate with your child's teacher about your child's progress. However, they are also a great way to discuss any concerns or questions you may have regarding your child. It is important that you take the time to think about the things you would like to discuss with your child's teacher, to ensure you make the most of your allocated time. The Parent - Teacher Interviews will be approximately **15 minutes in length** - just enough time for you and your child's teacher to meet and communicate. **Please be on time as we are unable to accommodate changes on the day.** Specialist and intervention teachers will also be available should you wish to discuss your child's progress.

Parents and carers will be given a letter about the Parent-Teacher Interviews next week. Parents/Carers will be able to nominate their time preference on the slip and will need to return this to their child's teacher without delay.

Congratulations to all our Year 6 students and the students from the Preca Centre who received the **Sacrament of Confirmation last Friday night**. The candidates were confirmed by the Most Reverend Martin Ashe, who is the Auxiliary Bishop for the Western Region. ### SCHOOL FEAST DAY 2023

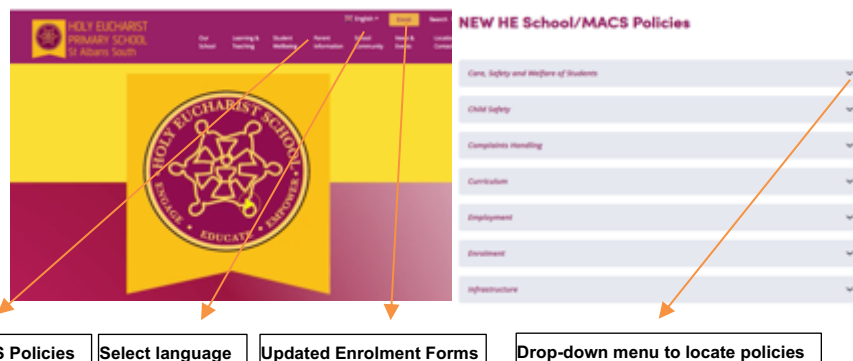

## UPDATE TO COVID-19 SETTINGS

**Students must stay at home if they are unwell or if they may have been exposed to COVID-19. This can prevent an entire class or the rest of the school having to quarantine.**

**Please remember**, it is vital that your child does not come to school, if they have a sore throat, a temperature, tummy pains or shortness of breath, otherwise they will be sent home immediately.

COVIDSafe measures have changed, however schools are required to continue to implement important practices to reduce the risk of COVID-19 transmission. Schools must keep their COVIDSafe Plan in place and will need to review and update these as required. Schools must continue to ensure air purifiers are used, external ventilation is maximised, good personal hygiene is encouraged, and face masks are made available for staff, students and visitors who wish to wear them.

It is recommended that rapid antigen tests (RATs) are used by students and staff if they:

- have symptoms of COVID-19 infection, no matter how mild
- are a household or close contact of someone who has COVID-19
- are a social contact of someone who has COVID-19.

The Department of Health recommends that all Victorians report their positive RAT result via the online form or by calling 1800 675 398. Principals are no longer required to inform their school community of a positive case associated with the school, and also, schools are no longer required to report COVID-19 case numbers to Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools (MACS).

RATs are available for all Victorians from council sites. Individuals can obtain two free packs (10 tests) for themselves and two free packs (10 tests) for each of their household members. People with disability and their carers can get up to four free packs (20 tests) in line with existing RAT distribution for people with disability.

This term, all students from Prep to Grade 6 have been enjoying learning the music of West Africa through drumming on traditional djembes. With enough drums for each child to have a go, we have experienced the benefits of drumming and working in a drum circle. Drumming provides such wonderful wellbeing benefits such as being in the moment, reducing anxiety and stress and boosting wellness, connecting the brain and body and providing a social experience where everyone is included.

Ms Eboni, the Performing Arts teacher, is qualified to lead the drumming and has been very happy with the way the students have responded and embraced this unit. With the younger students we have been using the drums to explore beat and rhythm, fast and slow, and strong and soft. The older students have learnt traditional Ghana rhythms and grooves. We have built up to an ensemble by adding our own dunun drums, traditional African shakers as well as bells. Despite it being quite loud for a little classroom, the energy and enjoyment has been huge!
