RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Unit: Our Sacramental Church Understandings:

- There are seven sacraments of the Catholic Church.
- Through the Sacrament of Holy Orders, the priest is gifted by the Holy Spirit to exercise the ministry of leadership and service.
- In the Sacrament of Penance, we celebrate our reconciliation with God, with ourselves, with each other and with the universe.
- The Catholic Church believes in the transforming presence of the Spirit in our world. The Church is united through the Holy Spirit.

ENGLISH

Reading and Viewing

Your child will be:

- Using the organisation of texts such as chapters, headings, subheadings, online home pages and sub pages of texts to assist their reading.
- Identifying different vocabulary and synonyms, and recognising that words can have different meanings in different contexts.
- Reading and comprehending informative texts by interpreting structural features, including tables of contents, glossaries, chapters, headings and subheadings.

Writing

Your child will be:

- Developing their understanding of spelling strategies (e.g. chunking, etymology).
- Planning, drafting and publishing informative print and multimodal texts, choosing text structures, language features, images and sound appropriate to purpose and audience.
- Using topic sentences and understanding that the starting point of a sentence is important for predicting how the text will unfold.
- Developing a handwriting style that is becoming legible, fluent and automatic.
- Rereading and editing their own and others' work using agreed criteria for text structures and language features.

Speaking and Listening

Your child will be:

- Asking specific questions to clarify a speaker's meaning.
- Listening to their peers during whole class discussions and providing feedback.
- Presenting and contributing actively to class and group discussions to further develop their oral language.

MATHEMATICS

Your child will be:

ADDITION & SUBTRACTION

- Using efficient mental strategies to solve addition and subtraction problems.
- Estimating and rounding off numbers to check the reasonableness of answers to calculations.

MEASUREMENT:

- Using measurement equipment to solve problems.
- Calculating the perimeter and area of rectangles, using appropriate units.
- Comparing 12 and 24-hour time systems and converting between them.

Topic: Staying Alive!

Learning Area: Biological Science

Big Question: What features and adaptations do living things have to help them survive in their environment?

Understandings:

- Living things need air, water and food to survive.
- Living things have made adaptations to help them survive in their environment.
- There is a relationship between plants, animals, and humans.
- An ecosystem is a community of living things and nonliving things in relationship with their environment.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Your child will be:

- Learning how to apply basic rules to games and demonstrate fair play when participating in physical activities.
- Performing activities that involve a transition from one skill to another, such as, stopping and passing or moving from leaping to balancing.
- Demonstrating water safety skills such as floating and treading water for three minutes and confidence in entering and exiting water, as well as learning important water safety skills.

THE ARTS

Visual Arts

Your child will be:

- Watching and discussing inspiring videos on Impressionist paintings by the famous artist Claude Monet.
- Differentiating between Realism and Impressionism as forms of art.
- Creating a painting inspired by Monet's artwork, titled 'Woman with a parasol'.

Performing Arts

Your child will be:

- Learning about different genres of music and instrumental and vocal ensembles, including Jazz and Hip Hop.
- Learning a traditional African groove on a djembe (African drum) and following the rehearsal process to perform for an audience.

LOTE - Language Other Than English - Italian

Your child will be:

- Interacting in classroom activities and creating shared class routines.
- Using spoken and written Italian to describe and give information about themselves.
- Creating imaginative texts using imaginary characters, places and ideas.
- Developing pronunciation and intonation of specific sounds.
- Sharing and comparing opinions about ideas in imaginative stories.

DIGITAL TECHNOLOGY

Your child will be:

- Continuing to examine how whole numbers are used as the basis for representing all types of data in digital systems (binary).
- Experimenting further with coding using alternate coding websites.
- Creating and experimenting with Makey Makey boards.
