### NEW SCHOOL CROSSING IN CHEDGEY DRIVE

At the end of term three, I received an email from the Brimbank Council regarding our request for a school crossing in Chedgey Drive. I'm pleased to inform you that the council has given this serious consideration and, following our onsite discussion with the Traffic and Transport Engineer, the council have agreed to move forward with the installation of a new school crossing at Chedgey Drive, St Albans.

The location of the new crossing will be just north-west of Oleander Drive. Importantly, the existing school crossing at Oleander Drive, St Albans, will not be removed at this time. The council will continue discussions following the installation of the 'Proposed' school crossing at Chedgey Drive.

This development is a significant step towards ensuring the safety of our students, and we are grateful for the council's cooperation in this matter. I will keep you updated on the progress of this project and any further discussions with the council.

### RENOVATION WORK IN THE MACKILLOP LEARNING CENTRE

During the school holidays, we embarked on an exciting renovation project within the MacKillop Learning Centre. The primary focus was the replacement of partition walls with permanent walls, aimed at enhancing the functionality and aesthetics of the space.

The new permanent walls have been successfully installed, creating a more defined and functional layout in the building. Notably, these new walls have introduced a walkway from each of the four classrooms leading to the multipurpose space. Additionally, the wall behind the large TV screen has also been extended.

The painting phase of the renovation is currently underway. Our plan is to ensure that the wall colours in the four classrooms and multipurpose space match the colour scheme in the new building. This transformation will become even more apparent once we remove the partition that connects the new building to the MacKillop building.

In preparation for the students' return to school from the holidays, the builders have steam cleaned the existing carpet, I am currently exploring the possibility of replacing the carpet to align with the flooring in the new building, if the budget allows.

We are excited about the positive changes that these renovations will bring to the MacKillop Learning Centre, creating an improved and flexible space for our students' educational journey.



### **FOOTPATH SAFETY**


During the school holidays, I arranged for a comprehensive safety assessment of the concrete pathways in our school grounds, including the lane way in O'Brien Drive.

We identified several areas that required adjustments to enhance safety and prevent tripping hazards. I'm pleased to inform you that many of these adjustments, which involved shaving the concrete, have been completed successfully. However, the workmen will need to return to finish off the remaining tasks to ensure that all pathways are safe and in excellent condition.

The pavers next to the new building will be readjusted as soon as the building works are completed.

### GAS HEATERS

All gas heaters in the school, including the hall, underwent a comprehensive safety inspection during the school break, and I am pleased to report that these inspections have been successfully completed.

### **NEW BUILDING**

The construction of our new building is well underway, with approximately 68% of the work completed. We are pleased to report that significant milestones have been achieved on Level 1. The security systems, data cables, and electrical wiring have all been successfully installed, ensuring a safe and technologically advanced environment for our students.

In mid-October, our builders have installed the plastering to the ceilings, the glazing for the windows on the upper floor. All external doors will be installed, marking another significant step toward completion. In mid-November they anticipate that the scaffolding will be removed. The installation of the lift is progressing smoothly and is expected to be completed by the end of this week, enhancing accessibility within the building for all members of our school community.

Additionally, we have taken an environmentally conscious step by installing solar panels, further aligning with our commitment to sustainability. We are confident that this new building will greatly enhance the learning experience for our students, providing them with modern, state-of-the-art facilities.

### RELIGIOUS EDUCATION



At Holy Eucharist Primary School, we are celebrating the Month of the Rosary and thinking about ways that we can contribute to our local community to help those in need. Each week, students from Grade 6 assist in packaging a range of items for people who visit the Loaves and Fishes Foodbank. At Holy Eucharist School, we will announce different fundraising initiatives throughout Term 4 through Class Dojo and so please support these when you can.

Our school is focusing on the **Joyful Mysteries of the Rosary** through weekly online Liturgies dedicated to each of the five Joyful mysteries. Last week, we mediated on the First Joyful Mystery, *The Annunciation.* This week, we focused on the Second Joyful Mystery, *The Visitation*.

During our reflection at the first two Rosary Liturgies, we focused on Father Jerome Santamaria's message that he provided during an interview about the theme of this year's World Youth Day, 'Arise and go with haste'. This is what he said about it:

'Arise and go with haste' comes from scripture at the beginning of the Gospel of St Luke. It is part of the story that we call, 'The Visitation' because it is when Our Lady, when she was pregnant, went to visit her cousin, Elizabeth. What is interesting about this story is that it goes with a story just before it called, 'The Annunciation', which is when the Angel Gabriel announced to Mary that she is going to be the Mother of God. These stories go together like a package team. If you are Christian, the two big rules are 'love of God' and 'love of neighbour' – but really, they are the same

thing. 'The Annunciation' is about 'love of God' and 'The Visitation' is about 'love of neighbour'. When the Angel Gabriel asked Mary if she wants to be God's Mother, she listens very closely and says, 'Yes'. Then the Angel Gabriel told Mary that her much older cousin is going to have a baby and she knows straight away that Elizabeth is going to need some help and again Mary says 'Yes' to going to help her cousin. So, our Lady is saying 'Yes' in two different ways - but basically the same way, 'Yes, I want to be God's Mother' and 'Yes I want to help the person in need'.

In our lives today, we can think about when we are going to say, 'Yes' to God, but also about when we are going to say 'Yes' to someone in need. We can think about how these are basically the same thing, but God is speaking in two different ways: one through prayer and the other through the need of the other person. God says that whenever you see someone who is lonely, He is with them. When you see someone who needs food, He is there with them. So maybe in your prayers, you can think about how you can say 'Yes' to God in your prayers, but also how you can say 'Yes' to God by serving someone. Think about who around you need help, and how you can best help them.
