

## THE FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT – YEAR B

Next Sunday's Gospel reading is taken from the Gospel of John.

Jesus predicts his suffering, death, and Resurrection and prepares his disciples to believe in the salvation that his death would accomplish.

Using the metaphor of the grain of wheat, Jesus presented the idea that his dying would be beneficial. He also taught that those who would be his disciples must follow his example of sacrifice.

### ✠ A reading from the holy Gospel according to John (12:20-33)

*Among those who went up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. These approached Philip, who came from Bethsaida in Galilee, and put this request to him, 'Sir, we should like to see Jesus.' Philip went to tell Andrew, and Andrew and Philip together went to tell Jesus.*

*Jesus replied to them: 'Now the hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified.'*

*I tell you most solemnly, unless a wheat grain falls on the ground and dies, it remains only a single grain; but if it dies, it yields a rich harvest. Anyone who loves his life loses it; anyone who hates his life in this world will keep it for the eternal life. If a man serves me, he must follow me, wherever I am, my servant will be there too. If anyone serves me, my Father will honour him. Now my soul is troubled. What shall I say: Father, save me from this hour? But it was for this very reason that I have come to this hour. Father, glorify your name!'*

*A voice came from heaven, 'I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again.'*

*People standing by, who heard this, said it was a clap of thunder; others said, 'It was an angel speaking to him.'*

*Jesus answered, 'It was not for my sake that this voice came, but for yours.'*

*'Now sentence is being passed on this world; now the prince of this world is to be overthrown.'*

*And when I am lifted up from the earth, I shall draw all men to myself.'*

*By these words he indicated the kind of death he would die.*

Dear Holy Eucharist Community,



### **CATHOLIC EDUCATION WEEK: 10–17 MARCH 2024**

All Catholic schools in the Archdiocese of Melbourne will celebrate Catholic Education Week 2024 from 10 to 17 March. The theme for Catholic Education Week 2024 is 'In the Light of Christ'. The Mass of St Patrick for Schools will take place on Friday 15 March 2024. Mr Pellaschiar, Mrs Xuereb, our two School Captains and 8 Grade 4 students will attend the Mass of St Patrick for Schools at the Cathedral.

There are 335 Catholic primary and secondary schools across Melbourne, enrolling more than 150,000 students and employing approximately 17,000 staff. Catholic schools provide a high-quality education in a faith-centred environment. This annual event is held to promote the special ethos of Catholic schools and to highlight the great things that take place in Catholic schools every day.



### **GATES WILL CLOSE AUTOMATICALLY AT 9AM!**

**All Prep to Year 6 classes begin at 8:55am.** If your child **arrives at school after 9am, they will need to enter via the Administration Gate**, as all other gates will be locked. **If your child arrives at school after 9:00am, they will need to obtain a late pass from the school office.** Each time a student is issued with a late pass, it is recorded on the roll, and will appear on the student's report card each semester.

The whole school has a literacy block in the morning where students participate in intensive reading and writing activities. Students who arrive late each day are missing out on specific instructions for given tasks. When children are late, teachers have to repeat instructions again, which takes them away from teaching the rest of the class who are at school on time.



### **CAMP AUSTRALIA – Out of Hours Care**

If you need to go to work or have other commitments before 8:30am, then your child/ren will need to go to **Before School Care**. Camp Australia is contracted by the school to provide this service from 7am each day until 8:30am. **After School Care** is also available from 3:10am until 6pm. Parents/Carers will need to enrol their child prior to their child attending the service, which will incur a fee (*Please note, you may be eligible to receive subsidies of up to 90% on Your OSHC fees with the Child Care Subsidy (CCS). We strongly recommend you apply for the CCS to determine your eligibility.*)

### **GRADE 5 CAMP**

The Grade 5s will be attending **Gundiwindi Camp** on **Monday 18<sup>th</sup> March until Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> March 2024**. The campsite is less than 50kms from Melbourne and is situated on the border of Wandin North and Silvan, Victoria. Gundiwindi has the most spectacular views of the surrounding mountains and bushland where the students can connect with nature and have a true 'bush' experience. 9 dedicated staff members will also attend to supervise and support the students



### **NAPLAN 2024**

Students in Year 3 and Year 5 commenced the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) on Wednesday 13<sup>th</sup> March 2024. NAPLAN closes on Monday 25<sup>th</sup> March 2024.

Schools have been asked to prioritise the tests within the first week of the testing window in order to accommodate students who may be absent from 13<sup>th</sup> - 25<sup>th</sup> March. These students will have the opportunity to complete the catch-up tests (for most subject areas) the following week.

NAPLAN is a nationwide measure through which parents, teachers, schools, education authorities, governments and the broader community can determine whether or not young Australians are developing the literacy and numeracy skills that provide the critical foundation for other learning and for their productive and rewarding participation in the community.

NAPLAN results allow parents/carers and educators to see how students are progressing in literacy and numeracy over time – individually, as part of their school community, and against national standards. The assessments are undertaken nationwide, every year, in the second full week in May.

NAPLAN is made up of tests in the four areas (or 'domains') of:

- Reading
- Writing
- Language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation)
- Numeracy.

### **THE AUSTRALIAN EARLY DEVELOPMENT CENSUS (AEDC)**

On 1<sup>st</sup> May 2024, our school will be taking part in the Australian Early Development Census (AEDC). This census is a nationwide census of early childhood development and helps schools and communities understand how children are developing before they start school, what is being done well, and what can be improved. The AEDC is an Australian Government initiative run by the Department of Education and Training. The AEDC highlights what is working well and what needs to be improved or developed to support children and their families by providing evidence to support health, education and community policy and planning.

The AEDC is held every three years and involves teachers of children in their first year of full-time school completing a research tool, the Australian version of the Early Development Instrument. The Instrument consist of about 100 questions and collects data relating to five key areas of early childhood development referred to as 'domains', these include:

- Physical health and wellbeing
- Social competence
- Emotional maturity
- Language and cognitive skills (school-based)
- Communication skills and general knowledge

Data is collected for individual children and reported for groups of children at a community, state/territory and national level. Please note that the AEDC is voluntary and is not a school test, so should you wish for your child/children's information to be excluded from the census, please contact Mr Bonnici.

### Enrolments are now open for 2025.

Children commencing Prep next year must be 5 years of age by 30<sup>th</sup> April 2025. We already have a number of applications for next year and we will begin interviewing families soon.

It is really important that our current families also register their child/children at the office if they wish to enrol them for Grade Prep in 2025.

### NEW BUILDING

I am pleased to report that the new building is at 90% completion. While I understand there have been delays in the project timeline, I want to assure you that the builders are working diligently to ensure its successful completion.

Here are some highlights of the recent progress:

- The carpet has been installed in 8 classrooms, and preparations for the vinyl flooring are underway.
- The air conditioning units have been fitted. Work has begun on the balustrade, on the stairwell and the safety banister on the learning deck.
- The roof on the lower level has been completed, and the roller door to the Physical Education storeroom has been installed.
- Pathways leading to the new building are currently under construction. The main entrance will be paved, and a new concrete path will be laid next to the library in the coming days.


