## HOLY THURSDAY –THE LORD’S SUPPER

During the Passover meal, Jesus breaks bread and gives it to his Disciples, uttering the words, "This is my body, which is given for you." Subsequently, he passes a cup filled with wine. He then says, "This is my blood..."

Holy Thursday is the day during Holy Week that commemorates the Washing of the Feet and Last Supper of Jesus Christ with the Apostles.

✠ **A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians (11:23-26)**

*Until the Lord comes, every time you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim his death.*

*This is what I received from the Lord, and in turn passed on to you: that on the same night that he was betrayed, the Lord Jesus took some bread, and thanked God for it and broke it, and he said, 'This is my body, which is for you; do this as a memorial of me.' In the same way he took the cup after supper, and said, 'This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Whenever you drink it, do this as a memorial of me.' Until the Lord comes, therefore, every time you eat this bread and drink this cup, you are proclaiming his death.*

### LENTEN CELEBRATION AND EASTER BONNET PARADE

Thursday 28<sup>th</sup> March is the last day of Term 1. We will be having a **Lenten Celebration in the Hall from 9:30am**. *All parents/carers are welcome.*

We will also be having an Easter Bonnet Parade and drawing the Easter Egg Raffle on the school oval (depending on the weather). **The parade will begin at 1:40pm**. *All parents/carers are welcome.*

The students are encouraged to put on their creative thinking caps and start designing and making an Easter hat to wear in the parade. There will be prizes awarded on the day for the most colourful and the most creative hats.

- **The students in Grade Prep, 1, 2 and 3 will be finishing school at 2:25pm (to alleviate the traffic congestion)**
- **The students in Grades 4, 5 and 6 will be finishing at 2:30pm**
- **After School Care will be available. Bookings are essential.**



### GATES CLOSE AUTOMATICALLY AT 9AM!

**All Prep to Year 6 classes begin at 8:55am.** If your child **arrives at school after 9am, they will need to enter via the Administration Gate**, as all other gates will be locked. **If your child arrives at school after 9:00am, they will need to obtain a late pass from the school office.** Each time a student is issued with a late pass, it is recorded on the roll, and will appear on the student's report card each semester.

The whole school has a literacy block in the morning where students participate in intensive reading and writing activities. Students who arrive late each day are missing out on specific instructions for given tasks. When children are late, teachers have to repeat instructions again, which takes them away from teaching the rest of the class who are at school on time.



### THE OFFICAL OPENING BLESSING AND NAMING OF OUR NEW BUILDING

The official opening, blessing and naming of our new building will be held on **Thursday 30<sup>th</sup> May 2024 - Feast of Corpus Christi/Body and Blood of Christ (Holy Eucharist - Our Feast Day!)**. ### CAMP AUSTRALIA – Out of Hours Care

If you need to go to work or have other commitments before 8:30am, then your child/ren will need to go to **Before School Care**. Camp Australia is contracted by the school to provide this service from 7am each day until 8:30am. **After School Care** is also available from 3:10am until 6pm. Parents/Carers will need to enrol their child prior to their child attending the service, which will incur a fee (*Please note, you may be eligible to receive subsidies of up to 90% on Your OSHC fees with the Child Care Subsidy (CCS).* We strongly recommend you apply for the CCS to determine your eligibility).

### THE AUSTRALIAN EARLY DEVELOPMENT CENSUS (AEDC)

On 1<sup>st</sup> May 2024, our school will be taking part in the Australian Early Development Census (AEDC). This census is a nationwide census of early childhood development and helps schools and communities understand how children are developing before they start school, what is being done well, and what can be improved. The AEDC is an Australian Government initiative run by the Department of Education and Training. The AEDC highlights what is working well and what needs to be improved or developed to support children and their families by providing evidence to support health, education and community policy and planning.

The AEDC is held every three years and involves teachers of children in their first year of full-time school completing a research tool, the Australian version of the Early Development Instrument. The Instrument consist of about 100 questions and collects data relating to five key areas of early childhood development referred to as 'domains', these include:

- Physical health and wellbeing
- Social competence
- Emotional maturity
- Language and cognitive skills (school-based)
- Communication skills and general knowledge

Data is collected for individual children and reported for groups of children at a community, state/territory and national level. Please note that the AEDC is voluntary and is not a school test, so should you wish for your child/children's information to be excluded from the census, please contact Mr Bonnici.



### SCHOOL ADVISORY COUNCIL

"The School Advisory Council is a living expression of the principle of subsidiarity in action and is informed by the theology and vision articulated in the MACS Statement of Mission and Working Together in Mission charter. In this light, School Advisory Councils play such a crucial role in the governance framework of MACS..."

The parish priest and school principal hold distinctive roles of leadership in their parish and school communities, and therefore it is essential that they work collaboratively to ensure that the relationship between parish and school is central to providing the religious leadership necessary for the success of the mission (Working Together in Mission, p. 1).

Holy Eucharist School's School Advisory Council is currently seeking two more council members from the school/parish community. No expertise is required, just a desire to represent and give voice to the school/parish body in advising the principal about important matters particularly related to the school's ongoing desire to provide the best possible education for our children.

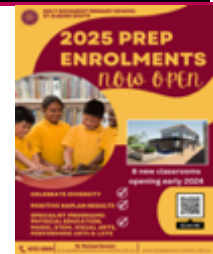
## PREP ENROLMENTS FOR 2025 - NOW OPEN

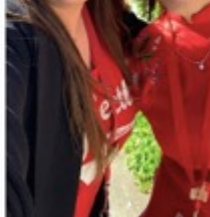
