SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - YEAR B

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John (6:1-15) He distributed to those who were seated as much as they wanted.

Jesus went off to the other side of the Sea of Galilee - or of Tiberias - and a large crowd followed him, impressed by the signs he gave by curing the sick. Jesus climbed the hillside, and sat down there with his disciples. It was shortly before the Jewish feast of Passover.



Looking up, Jesus saw the crowds approaching and said to Philip, Where can we buy some bread for these people to eat?' He only said this to test Philip; he himself knew exactly what he was going to do. Philip answered, 'Two hundred denarii would only buy enough to give them a small piece each.' One of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said, 'There is a small boy here with five barley loaves and two fish; but what is that between so m any?" Jesus said to them, 'Make the people sit down.' There was plenty of grass there, and as many as five thousand men sat down. Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks and gave them out to all who were sitting ready; he then did the same with the fish, giving out as much as was wanted. When they had eaten enough he said to the disciples, 'Pick up the pieces left over, so that nothing gets wasted.' So they picked them up, and filled twelve hampers with scraps left over from the meal of five barley loaves. The people, seeing this sign that he had given, said, 'This really is the prophet who is to come into the world.' Jesus, who could see they were about to come and take him by force and make him king, escaped back to the hills by himself.

NAPLAN REPORTS

Last week, our Year 3s and Year 5s received their 2024 NAPLAN reports. From 2023, new standards were introduced to NAPLAN reporting. This reporting replaces the previous numerical NAPLAN reporting bands and national minimum standards. Education ministers agreed 2023 was the right time to introduce this change alongside moving NAPLAN to March. Proficiency standards provide clear information on student achievement. They are set at a challenging but reasonable level expected for the child at the time of NAPLAN testing, based mainly on what has been taught in previous years of schooling.



There are 4 proficiency levels:

- Exceeding: The student's result exceeds expectations at the time of testing.
- Strong: The student's result meets challenging but reasonable expectations at the time of testing.
- Developing: The student's result indicates that they are working towards expectations at the time of testing.
- Needs additional support: The student's result indicates that they are not achieving the learning outcomes expected at the time of testing. They are likely to need additional support to progress satisfactorily.

To ensure all Year 6 students are placed in a secondary school for Year 7 parents/carers will need to complete these forms and return to school without delay. Parents will receive notification of their child's Year 7 placement in a government secondary school on Wednesday 17 July 2024. Please note, that Year 7 Catholic Secondary School enrolments close 16th August 2024.

HEALTH DEPARTMENT ALERT - INCREASING WHOOPING COUGH CASES (PERTUSSIS)

The Victorian Health Department recently issued a public notice in relation to an increasing number of cases of whooping cough (pertussis) in Victoria, particularly among children aged 10-12.

Pertussis is a highly contagious respiratory illness known for causing a cough, and can lead to life threatening infections in babies. Many babies who get pertussis catch it from older children and adults who might not even know they are infected.

Pertussis usually begins with cold-like symptoms, such as a dry cough (occurring in bouts), characteristic 'whooping' sound when breathing in, tiredness, runny nose, and low-grade fever.

Please speak to your doctor (GP) and seek a diagnosis if your child is exhibiting any of these symptoms. Early identification and separation are crucial in preventing the spread to other children.

Pertussis is mostly spread to other people by droplets from coughing or sneezing, so good hygiene practices and immunisations help prevent the spread. Immunisations are particularly important for infants and pregnant women.

If pertussis is diagnosed, your GP will advise on appropriate treatments. If you have any questions, please speak to your GP. Read the full alert here: https://www.health.vic.gov.au/health-advisories/increasing-pertussis-whooping-cough-cases-in-victoria

For diagnosed cases:

- The treating doctor can provide specific advice in relation to exclusion periods from school, and can verify when exclusion periods can be ended.
- Children diagnosed with pertussis to be exclude from primary schools and children's services for a minimum period of 21 days after the onset of cough, or until they have completed 5 days of a course of antibiotic treatment.
- The treating doctor will complete the required notifications to the Department of Health
- Schools should notify MACS via the report form on CEVN or at ohs@macs.vic.edu.au

For contacts of diagnosed cases:

- The exclusion requirement only applies to contacts who meet all three of these criteria: -aged less than 7 years:
- -in the same room as the child with the diagnosed case; and
- -have not received three effective doses of pertussis vaccine
- Children meeting these criteria should be excluded for 14 days after the last exposure to the infectious case, or until they have taken 5 days of a course of effective antibiotic treatment.



PREP ENROLMENTS FOR 2025 - NOW OPEN

Enrolments are still open for 2025.

Children commencing Prep next year must be 5 years of age by 30th April 2025. We already have a number of applications for next year and we have already begun interviewing families.

It is really important that our current families also register their child/children at the office if they wish to enrol them for Grade Prep in 2025.



NUMERACY - AUSTRALIAN MATHEMATICS COMPETITION (AMC)

Once again, this year, students in Grades 3-6 (only) have the opportunity to participate in the Australian Mathematics Competition (AMC). Consent forms for the competition will be sent home. The forms need to be returned no later than July 29th to ensure registration. This is not a compulsory competition, students choose if they would like to participate and should only return the form if they are committed to competing.

The AMC is an engaging and challenging 30-problem competition that demonstrates the importance and relevance of mathematics in students' everyday lives; it is open to students in years 3 to 12. Australia's leading educators and academics, with a deep understanding of our national curriculum standards, actively design the unique AMC problems each year.



The competition will take place online between August 6-8, and will be conducted during school hours.

To prepare for the competition at home there are two free online resources available to students and families:


