

On Monday, I will begin a pilgrimage retracing the footsteps of Saint Paul, alongside the principals from our region. We will start with a tour of Christian Athens, including visits to the Acropolis and the Areopagus, where Saint Paul delivered his famous sermon about God. We will also journey to ancient Corinth, where Saint Paul lived for nearly two years, spreading the word of God and converting many to the faith.

Later in the week, we are privileged to visit Meteora, a place of extraordinary natural beauty. Meteora is home to towering rock formations that have stood for centuries. It was here, over 600 years ago, that Byzantine monks established a monastic community in their devotion to God.
