## ALL SAINTS DAY AND ALL SOULS DAY

As we enter November, we have two special days of remembrance in the Christian tradition: All Saints' Day on November 1st and All Souls' Day on November 2nd.

On All Saints Day, we celebrate all the saints who have gone before us: those known and unknown, remembered and forgotten. It is a day to recognise the lives of those who exemplified faith, courage, and dedication and to draw inspiration from their legacy.

The following day is All Souls Day. On this day and throughout November, we remember those who have died: friends, colleagues, relatives, leaders whom we have known, worked with, laughed with, wept with, or even walked with.

We now pray for them, and remember them with love, celebrating in faith their journey to God, now within the great communion of saints.



## FOOTSTEPS OF SAINT PAUL

Last week, I returned from my overseas trip, during which I went on a pilgrimage, tracing the footsteps of Saint Paul in Greece and Turkey. I also took Long Service Leave to visit family in Malta. While in Malta, I continued following in Saint Paul's footsteps on my own, with the opportunity to visit some significant historical sites. Below, I've shared some information and photos from my visit.



### St Paul's Island

The Acts of the Apostles tell the story of how Saint Paul was shipwrecked on an island which Chapter 28 identifies as Malta, while on his way to Rome to face charges in 60 AD.

The statue on Saint Paul's Island, inaugurated in 1845, stands 4 meters high and is thought to mark the spot where Saint Paul was shipwrecked.



### Church of Saint Paul's Shipwreck

The Church of Saint Paul's Shipwreck is located in Valletta, Malta's capital city. It displays a relic of Saint Paul's right wrist-bone, and part of the column from San Paolo alle Tre Fontane, on which he was beheaded in Rome.



### Saint Paul's Grotto

This grotto is believed to be where Saint Paul stayed after being shipwrecked in Malta in 60 AD. He was travelling from Crete to Rome to stand trial before Julius Caesar. During his three-month stay in the cave, Saint Paul is said to have preached and spread the Word of God, leading to the introduction of Christianity in Malta. The cave later became a site of worship and pilgrimage.



### Mosta

The Mosta is a Minor Basilica dedicated to Our Lady of the Assumption. It features one of the world's largest unsupported domes and displays a replica of a World War II bomb that crashed through the dome during morning Mass. Miraculously, the bomb did not detonate upon impact.



### Saint Paul's Catacombs

Used as a burial ground from Punic to Byzantine times, Saint Paul's Catacombs provide the largest archaeological evidence of early Christianity in Malta.

Although a myth suggests they were connected to Saint Paul's Grotto, recent studies show that both were part of a large cemetery near the ancient city of Melite.



### Our Lady of Mellieħa.

This Sanctuary is Malta's oldest Marian shrine. It was built on a cave and is linked to the island's Christian origins. Tradition holds that after Saint Paul's shipwreck in 60 AD, Saint Luke painted a fresco of the Virgin Mary in the cave, and it may have been consecrated by Saint Paul or later bishops. Though the exact date of consecration is unclear, a Greek inscription and crosses marked the event, with the crosses surviving today.

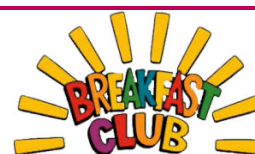
### ASSESSMENT AND REPORTING – SEMESTER 2
