The Ascension of the Lord - Year C ★ A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke (24:46-53) While blessing them, he was taken to heaven.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'You see how it is written that the Christ would suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that, in his name, repentance for the forgiveness of sins would be preached to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses to this. 'And now I am sending down to you what the Father has promised. Stay in the city then,

until you are clothed with the power from on high.' Then he took them out as far as the outskirts of Bethany, and lifting up his hands he blessed them. Now as he blessed them, he withdrew from them and was carried up to heaven. They worshipped him and then went back to Jerusalem full of joy; and they were continually in the Temple praising God.

Last week, a very upset local resident confronted a staff member on duty and reported that some parents/carers from our school have been blocking her driveway and sitting on her front fence at home time. I am especially grateful to our staff who attended the ceremony and those who acted as sponsors for our students. A heartfelt thank you also goes to Most Reverend Martin Ashe (Auxiliary Bishop of Melbourne) for leading the ceremony, and to Father Robin and Father Joseph for concelebrating the Mass.



Parents and carers should have received the placement pack for government schools which includes the current application for Year 7 placement form. To ensure all Year 6 students are placed in a secondary school for Year 7 parents/carers will need to complete these forms and return to school without delay.

Parents will receive notification of their child's Year 7 placement in a government secondary school on Tuesday 1 July 2025.



#### CAMP AUSTRALIA – Out of Hours Care

If you need to go to work or have other commitments before 8:30am, then your child/ren will need to go to **<u>Before School Care</u>**. Camp Australia is contracted by the school to provide this service from 7am each day until 8:30am. <u>After School Care</u> is also available from 3:10am until 6pm. Parents/Carers will need to enrol their child prior to their child attending the service, which will incur a fee (*Please note, you may be eligible to receive subsidies of up to 90% on Your OSHC fees with the Child Care Subsidy (CCS). We strongly recommend you apply for the CCS to determine your eligibility).*
