



# **CAMP AUSTRALIA – Out of Hours Care**

If you need to go to work or have other commitments before 8:30am, then your child/ren will need to go to **Before School Care**. Camp Australia is contracted by the school to provide this service from 7am each day until 8:30am. **After School Care** is also available from 3:10am until 6pm. Parents/Carers will need to enrol their child prior to their child attending the service, which will incur a fee (*Please note, you may be eligible to receive subsidies of up to 90% on Your OSHC fees with the Child Care Subsidy (CCS). We strongly recommend you apply for the CCS to determine your eligibility).*

As we look ahead to Term 4, we'd like to remind all families that students and staff are required to wear a hat when outdoors, in line with our SunSmart policy.


It is a school expectation that all students:

We hope all dads and father figures had a wonderful Father's Day. Thank you for being part of our school community at Holy Eucharist.












#### **Mandarin Tree Planting Ceremony**
