VANDALISM DURING THE SCHOOL HOLIDAYS

All line-marking turf has been pulled up and removed. While the lines are no longer visible, the area remains safe for use. We are currently arranging repairs and hope to have the surface restored as soon as possible. The matter has been reported to the police, and relevant surveillance footage has been provided to assist with their investigation.



INGROUND BASKETBALL RING

I would like to inform you that temporary fencing has been placed around one of our in-ground basketball rings after it was damaged by a car during one of the weekend parish Masses. The basketball ring requires repair before the area can be safely used again. The basketball ring has since been professionally assessed, and we are hopeful that repairs will be completed as soon as possible. We are currently in the process of coordinating the necessary work and will keep you updated on the expected timeline for its return to use. In the meantime, the area will remain securely fenced off to ensure the safety of all students, staff, and visitors.

WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECKS (WWCC)

Working with Children Checks are legally required for child-related work. If a person is engaging in child-related work, it is a legal requirement under the Worker Screening Act 2020 that they must, at a minimum, have a valid Working with Children Clearance unless an exemption applies.

Child-related work is defined in the Worker Screening Act 2020 as work that:

- involves an adult working with children under 18 years old (both paid and unpaid work)
- usually involves direct contact with a child or children, including physical, face-to-face, written, oral or electronic contact and
- the contact with the child or children is a usual part of the person's duties and is not occasional direct contact which is incidental to their work.

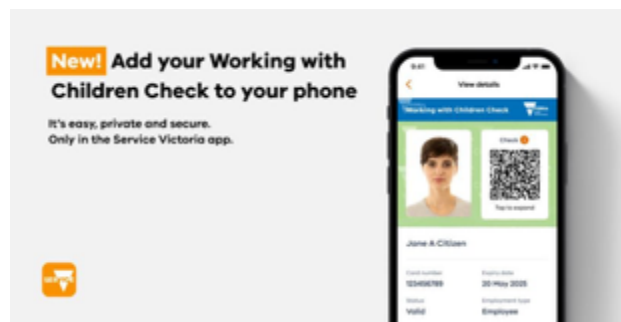
An activity may be 'child-related work' regardless of whether the contact with a child is supervised by another person or not. This means even if a volunteer or visitor is supervised by a teacher, they must still have (and provide evidence of) a current Working with Children Clearance if they are performing 'child-related work'.

Examples of child-related work activities

- Attendant care
- School camps
- Incursions
- Excursions (including swimming)
- Literacy and numeracy support
- Homework clubs, breakfast clubs, lunch clubs, leadership or cultural workshops and other student support activities
- Distance education
- Work in an early childhood education and care service on school grounds (for example, kindergarten or playgroup)

Examples of child-related work roles

- Classroom or library assistant
- Sporting, musical and other extracurricular coaches
- Canteen and uniform shop assistant
- Allied health or NDIS therapists
- Department staff who are working with children
- Special Religious Instruction instructors
- Chaplains
- School camp or excursion support
- Mentors and guides from partner organisations
- Volunteering in the classroom (in any capacity)



The department recommends that schools require anyone who volunteers regularly or who assists with excursions, camps or similar events obtain a Working with Children Clearance given the contact volunteers may have with other students in these situations.

FEAST OF ST GEORGE PRECA 9th MAY

The Society of Christian Doctrine, also known as the Preca Community, was founded by Saint George Preca in 1907. It is a community of lay men and women who live according to a rule and constitution written by St George Preca himself. The Society was canonically approved by the Archbishop of Malta in 1932.

St George Preca was born in 1880 in Valletta, the capital of Malta, and was ordained a priest in 1906. Even before his ordination, he felt a strong calling to deepen the Catholic faith of the Maltese people. From an early age, he was deeply prayerful and open to God's inspiration.

He gathered a small group of lay men, and later women, forming them in the Catholic faith so they could teach others. His mission was inspired by the words of Saint Paul to Timothy: "And the things you have heard me say in the presence of many witnesses entrust to reliable people who will also be qualified to teach others" (2 Tim 2:2).

St George Preca inspired his followers with a strong zeal to spread the Word of God through teaching across the islands of Malta and Gozo. The acronym M.U.S.E.U.M *Magister Utinam Sequatur Evangelium Universus Mundus*, reflects his prayer: "Divine Teacher, may the whole world follow the Gospel." In 1956, he sent the first six members of the Society to Australia to continue this mission.

Despite often being in poor health, St George Preca remained dedicated to teaching through both his spoken and written words. He authored around 140 books and booklets, many of which have been translated into various languages, including English.

Known for his humility and sincerity, St George Preca lived a life of faithful service. He died on 26 July 1962, just as the Church, during the Second Vatican Council, was preparing to affirm the important role of the laity, something he had long championed.

His feast day is celebrated on 9 May, the date on which he was beatified by Pope John Paul II.



SCHOOL REVIEW

In Victoria, schools are regularly reviewed to ensure they meet the minimum standards and requirements for registration. This process is mandated by the Victorian Registration and Qualifications Authority (VRQA) and the Victorian Catholic Education Authority (VCEA). School Review encompasses two key dimensions: Improvement and Compliance.

Catholic schools in the Archdiocese of Melbourne participate in a Compliance Review every five years and a School Improvement Framework (SIF) Review every four years. The Compliance Review ensures that schools meet the minimum standards for registration, including adherence to the Child Safe Standards.

The SIF Review supports deep learning and the ongoing monitoring of school improvement as part of a continuous four-year cycle within the School Improvement Framework. Together, these review processes support both schools and the wider system in fostering continuous improvement, while also ensuring ongoing compliance with external legislative and regulatory requirements.

Our school will be participating in both the Compliance Review and the School Improvement Review in mid-July this year.



CAMP AUSTRALIA – Out of Hours Care

If you need to go to work or have other commitments before 8:30am, then your child/ren will need to go to **Before School Care**. Camp Australia is contracted by the school to provide this service from 7am each day until 8:30am. **After School Care** is also available from 3:10am until 6pm. Parents/Carers will need to enrol their child prior to their child attending the service, which will incur a fee (*Please note, you may be eligible to receive subsidies of up to 90% on Your OSHC fees with the Child Care Subsidy (CCS). We strongly recommend you apply for the CCS to determine your eligibility.*)

GLENNEN BUILDING RENOVATION UPDATE

I would like to provide an update on the refurbishment of the Glennen Building, with significant progress made over the school holiday period.

Prior to the holidays, Raysett Builders completed all necessary assessments to facilitate the safe removal of asbestos from the building. As you may be aware, asbestos was commonly used in construction during the 1970s and 1980s and remains safe when undisturbed. The school conducts regular safety checks and audits, and we have successfully met all required safety standards and inspections.

During the school holidays, all asbestos was safely removed while no staff or students were onsite. Following this, demolition works commenced last week. To date, internal walls, windows, and doors have been removed.

Over the coming weeks, the builders will proceed with removing the roof and selected sections of the slab. At the completion of this stage, only the external brick/block walls and portions of the slab will remain, preparing the site for the next phase of construction.

We will continue to keep you informed as the project progresses.
