CONSTRUCTION CEREMONY – COMMENCEMENT OF THE LEONIE GLENNEN LEARNING CENTRE REDEVELOPMENT

On Thursday, Holy Eucharist School celebrated an exciting milestone with the commencement ceremony of the redevelopment of our Leonie Glennen Learning Centre.

The occasion brought together members of our school community, including representatives from the Victorian Catholic Education Authority (VCEA), Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools (MACS), MINX Architecture, Raysett Constructions, Ms Rowena Gonzales from the Catholic Development Fund (CDF), our Parish Priest, Fr Tuan-Anh Do, members of our School Advisory Council, staff, student leaders and school delegates. Unfortunately, the Honourable Natalie Suleyman MP was called to an urgent Cabinet meeting this morning and is represented here today by Mr Nordin Hammouche. We thank Nordin for joining us on her behalf.

The redevelopment will see an extensive refurbishment of our Junior School building, including eight classrooms, student toilets and a meeting room. A particularly exciting feature will be the transformation of the existing courtyard into a multi-purpose learning space, providing greater flexibility and opportunities for contemporary teaching and learning.

The project represents a significant investment in the future of Holy Eucharist School. Through the Building Fund for Non-Government Schools, the school has received \$1.4 million from the Victorian Government, with the school contributing a further \$1.4 million, alongside additional financial support through a loan from the Catholic Development Fund (CDF).

This redevelopment is about much more than renovating an ageing building. It is an investment in our students, staff and the future of our school. The renewed learning spaces will provide contemporary, welcoming environments that support collaboration, creativity, engagement, wellbeing and learning.

The original Junior School building has been an important part of our school's history for 51 years, with generations of students learning, playing and forming friendships within its walls. For me, the redevelopment carries an added personal significance, having been a student in the very same building.

The occasion also provided an opportunity to acknowledge the legacy of Sr Leonie Glennen, who passed away in January this year. It is particularly fitting that her name will continue to be associated with a learning centre that will serve and inspire generations of students into the future.

As construction gets underway, we acknowledge that there will be challenges and some disruption along the way. We sincerely thank our students, staff and families for their patience, flexibility and cooperation as we work through this exciting project together.

The ceremony concluded with Fr Tuan-Anh blessing the first brick, marking the official beginning of the redevelopment and symbolising the strong foundations upon which our school community continues to build.

This project honours our past, responds to our present needs and invests in our future. We look forward to watching the redevelopment take shape and, most importantly, seeing our students learn, grow and flourish in these new spaces.

Throughout each year, we pause to listen to our students, families and staff to gauge how our learning community is travelling. This feedback is invaluable to our progress as effective school communities and is backed by evidence-based research and best practices.

A significant and formal way in which we engage and gather data is through MACSSIS, the Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools – School Improvement Surveys. One of the main goals of the MACSSIS survey is to identify the strengths and areas for improvement within our school. We believe it is important that you have a voice in order to contribute to shaping the ongoing improvement of Holy Eucharist School.

The survey will be accessible online in English and in various other languages and dialects, from Monday 31st August and will need to be completed by Friday 18th September 2026. All participation is invited, welcomed and 100% voluntary. The surveys are not a test; they are an inclusive way to inform the work we are already doing to improve our school. Everyone has the right to refuse to participate, or withdraw from the survey at any point before, during, or after completion of the survey. Please notify the school if your child (Years 4-6) does not wish to participate. REMINDER - MORNING ARRIVAL AND AFTERNOON PICK-UP

To ensure the safety and wellbeing of all students, I would like to remind families of our school procedures for morning arrival and afternoon pick-up. Your cooperation helps us provide a safe and well-organised start and finish to each day of learning at school.

Parents and carers are required to be familiar with all school policies available on the school website. In particular, I wish to draw your attention to the [Attendance Policy](#) and the [Supervision Policy](#) which outlines the expectations and responsibilities regarding student attendance, punctuality, and communication with the school. These policies can be found on our [school website](#).

Morning Arrival

- **School gates open at 8:30am.** Students are welcome to enter the school grounds from this time. The yard is supervised by staff.
- At **8:45am**, students line up and wait for their classroom teacher:
 - **Prep to Year 3:** Basketball court
 - **Years 4 to 6:** Oval
- At **8:45am**, teachers will collect their classes and take students to their classrooms.

All school gates close at 8:55am, and learning begins promptly at this time.

If your child arrives **after 8:55am**, a parent or carer **must accompany them to the Administration Office** to sign them in and provide a reason for their late arrival. Your child will then be issued with an **orange late pass** to give to their teacher, indicating that they have been signed in and marked as late on the attendance roll. **Students must not be left outside the gate to enter the school alone.**

Afternoon Dismissal

Prep to Year 3: 3:10pm

Years 4 to 6: 3:15pm

We ask that parents and carers collect their children promptly at the end of the school day.

Students who have **not been collected by 3:30pm** should be attending **After School Care**, not waiting in the Administration Office. If you arrive after **3:30pm**, you will be required to come into the Administration Office to sign your child out before leaving the school. Students will not be permitted to leave the office until they have been signed out.

Please note that **families who repeatedly collect their children after the designated collection time will be required to enrol their child with Camp Australia** for them to attend **After School Care**. This policy is necessary due to the additional staff supervision required after school hours.

STUDENTS TAKING EXTENDED LEAVE FROM SCHOOL

We have noticed an increase in the number of students taking extended leave during the school term to go on family holidays.

While we understand that family travel is important, extended absences can have a significant impact on a child's learning. Students miss valuable classroom instruction, collaborative learning opportunities and assessment tasks, and often return needing to catch up on work that cannot always be replicated at home.

If your child will be absent from school for an extended period, **the school office must be notified before the leave commences**. An **Extended Leave Application** must be completed and submitted for the Principal's approval. This process ensures that the school is aware of the planned absence and that attendance records are managed appropriately.

We appreciate your support in planning family holidays, wherever possible, during the school holiday periods to minimise disruption to your child's learning. Regular school attendance is essential for academic success and wellbeing. **Every minute at school counts!**

CAMP AUSTRALIA – Out of Hours Care

If you need to go to work or have other commitments before 8:30am, then your child/ren will need to go to **Before School Care**. Camp Australia is contracted by the school to provide this service from 7am each day until 8:30am. **After School Care** is also available from 3:10am until 6pm. Parents/Carers will **need to enrol their child prior to their child attending the service**, which will incur a fee (*Please note, you may be eligible to receive subsidies of up to 90% on Your OSHC fees with the Child Care Subsidy (CCS). We strongly recommend you apply for the CCS to determine your eligibility*).
